Dr. Adion provided video presentations of SP products produced by women farmer groups in Central Luzon. The products she featured included Pan de-Botolan, SP cookies, noodles, nachos, piaya, chips, halaya, leche-halaya, wine, vinegar, and candies. All products, according to the presentation, are incorporated with SP to enhance its nutrient and fiber content.

City of Dasmariñas raises defense against dengue



(From page 1) In response, the City Government of Dasmariñas steps up its counter-operation against this mosquito-borne disease.

Since an ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure, the City geared up its various dengue preventive measures. Firstly, it launched a regular misting and fogging campaign for a mass clean-up drive.

In addition, in view of the increasing dengue cases and in order to expedite the release of funds for the purchase of blood diagnostic kits and other medical supplies for patients, the City Government placed the entire City

under a state of calamity by virtue of Resolution No. 170-S-2019 last July 16, 2019.

Not only does the City Government focus on prevention but also on addressing the actual dengue cases it recorded within its jurisdiction. As a matter of fact, it extended the No-Balance-Billing (NBB) Program to dengue patients admitted at the Pagamutan ng Dasmariñas.

Recently, the City Government leveled up its effort against this mosquito epidemic.

Through the initiative of Congressman Pidi Barzaga and Mayor Jennifer Austria-Barzaga, the Pagamutan ng Dasmariñas made representations with the Philippine Red Cross (PRC) to set up an emergency medical tent.

This shall serve as an extension of dengue ward and a fast lane to cater patients of the outbreak. Their efforts materialized and said tent was installed on August 8 to 9 and became operational on August 10, 2019.

The rub hall tent of the PRC which sits on a 25m x10m dimension is installed at the parking area in front of the hospital Out-Patient-Department (OPD).

This Dengue Emergency Medical Unit (DEMU) houses twenty-five (25) double-deck beds.

The City Government provided its lighting system with the installation of fourteen (14) pieces of T5 fluorescent lights and one (1) 50-watt fog light. It also equipped the tent with thirteen (13) 3-gang convenient outlets, two (2) industrial air cooler, and two (2) units of 3-Toner Air Conditioning Unit.

All these equipment are powered by the electric supply provided and paid by the City Government. Moreover, it put up two (2) portalets to quickly provide sanitation services to patients. One (1) Dasmariñas tent was installed to shelter these portalets.

Aside from the technical support, the City Government also assigned nurses to render duty with the Red Cross volunteers.

The PRC has indeed become instrumental in this major counter dengue response. The City Government deeply expresses its gratitude to the Red Cross team deployed in the City:

veloped by the Tarlac Agricultural University. Production of CPM as an enterprise improved their income and gave them a reputation as supplier of CPM.

Meanwhile, Azotea presented the SP coco yam energy bar, which uses sweetpotato and coco oil have short storage life.

Meanwhile, the Portable Vacuum Frying System was presented by Dr. Tan. SPs that are usually boiled or fried with Vacuum-frying, he mentioned, produces healthy energy bars available in the market, which typically uses oats, quinoa, or pressure and temperature to improve the quality attributes of fried products.

An alternative to the expensive vacuum frying machines, the Portable Vacuum Frying System has no expensive vacuum pump. The pump is re-

placed with a water pump and water jet, added Dr. Tan.

Lastly, Dr. Bacusmo discussed the different varieties of SP for various uses. He mentioned that they have been developing better SP varieties since 1997.

Encouraging the farmers to plant better varieties of SP, he mentioned that they have developed clones that are ready for planting.

FIESTA is a technology promotion, transfer, and commercialization platform initiated by the Philippine Council for Agriculture, Aquatic and Natural Resources of the Department of Science and Technology. (Philippine Press Club, Inc. (PPCI))

Pacardo, a co-inventor of Crop X Pro, presented the different Crop X Pro technologies on SP processing.

He identified difficulties in manual processing of SP and said that available machines are very expensive and have to be imported from other countries. According to Pacardo, the Crop X Pro machines are capable of converting squeezed pulps

into powder as well as SP leaves into juice. He also added that all machines are zero-waste and use clean and improved processing techniques.

Meanwhile, the Portable Vacuum Frying System was presented by Dr. Tan. SPs that are usually boiled or fried with Vacuum-frying, he mentioned, produces healthy energy bars available in the market, which typically uses oats, quinoa, or pressure and temperature to improve the quality attributes of fried products.

As support to the volunteers, the City Government gives them allowance and provides them meals throughout the day. As of August 15, 2019, there were twenty-three (23) dengue patients at the emergency tent. Just this Thursday, August 15, 2019, Cong. Pidi and Mayor Jenny visited the patients and distributed financial assistance to them.

The dengue treatment tent typically runs only for a month, hence its operation is bound to conclude on September 10, 2019.

However, Cong. Pidi and Mayor Jenny are making an arrangement for it to be extended to three (3) months. Nevertheless, by next year, it will allocate funds to purchase and set up its own rub hall type tent to be used as exten-

sion of the hospital to cater medical emergency such as this.

Prior to this partnership with PRC, the City Government has already started maximizing the hospital resources. As a matter of fact, the Pagamutan ng Dasmariñas converted its Family Medicine Ward into a dengue quarter and has outsourced medical staff to accommodate the patients.

As of August 12, 2019, three-hundred forty-five (345) patients were attended at the Pagamutan ng Dasmariñas. One hundred sixty-six (166) of which were admitted. Despite the installation of the medical tent, twelve (12) dengue patients were still catered at the Pediatric Ward; two (2) at the Family Medicine Ward; and one (1) at the Intensive Care Unit (ICU).

The City Government urges all its consti-

tuents to immediately seek medical assistance once dengue symptoms persist. Most importantly, it implores every Dasmariñeño to stand united in fighting against the dengue epidemic.

Everyone is encouraged to observe proper solid waste management and band together in a massive clean-up.

Apart from the continued, 'search and destroy' operation and the city-wide fogging, the City Government believes that the one real solution remains the same and it is a clean surrounding.

All Dasmariñeños are then reminded of their responsibility to maintain the cleanliness not just of their home but also of their immediate surroundings.

KBAs in Cebu assessed using Permanent Biodiversity Monitoring System

KBAs or Key Biodiversity Area, according to BirdLife International, are sites that are considered globally significant to conserve biodiversity. In the Philippines there are different regions that are called key Biodiversity Areas (KBAs).

Cebu in Central Visayas (Region VII) has various KBAs. Cebu Technological University (CTU) Argao started a three-year project titled, Flora and Fauna Assessment Using Permanent Biodiversity Monitoring System (PBMS) in Cebu Island KBAs in January 2018 and will conclude in December 2020.

The KBAs to be monitored are Mt. Kungbulgasing and Lanaya, Mt. Lantoy, and Mt. Kapayas.

The goal of the project led by Dr. Archibald Baltazar B. Malaki is to create a more effective and localized biodiversity monitoring and natural resource management system in the Island of Cebu, sustainably managed by the local stakeholders backed-up by collectively agreed management policies and guidelines.

With the use of PBMS, diverse flora and fauna species will be assessed and monitored. The generated data will be stored in a database managed by CTU. This will help the local government of Cebu, as well as the public, to properly manage the protected areas and promote biodiversity conservation.

The Department of

Science and Technology (DOST), through its Niche Centers in the Regions for R&D (NICER) program, granted CTU Argao with P17 million budget to proceed with the said project.

The NICER program is under the Science for Change (S4C) program of DOST, specifically the Accelerated R&D Program for Capacity Building of Research and Development Institutions and Industrial Competitiveness.

It aims to capacitate Higher Educational Institutions (HEIs) such as CTU by handling quality research to achieve regional development. The project is also closely monitored by the Philippine Council for Agriculture, Aquatic and Natural Resources Research and Development of the DOST (DOST-PCAARRD).

According to Dr. Malaki, the establishment of PBMS is necessary for "planning, project formulation, budget allocation, identification of research needs and directing management intervention programs for municipalities containing the KBAs in Cebu province."

As of October 2018, a total of 3,268 individuals, 63 bird species, and 33 families were documented in all four sampling sites or KBAs.

The project was one of the technologies featured by DOST-PCAARRD during the National Science and Technology Week (NSTW) on July 17-21, 2019 at the World Trade Center, Pasay City. (Philippines Press Club, Inc. (PPCI))
