President Rodrigo Roa Duterte on Thursday, February 7, expressed his frustration over the perennial problem of red tape and corruption in the government.

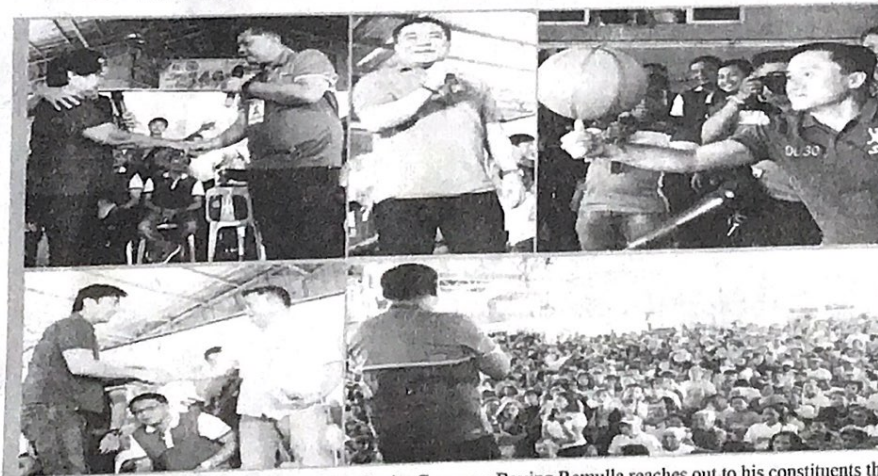
During the oath-taking of newly appointed officials in Malacañan Palace, President Duterte revealed that he walked out of the Cabinet meeting on Wednesday when he learned about the problem of bureaucratic red tape at the National Economic and Development Authority (NEDA). "I would just like to share an experience with you. Last night, we had this Cabinet meeting. Though no fault of any-

(From page 1) The fact that while individual public markets, fast food restaurants, and other similar establishments from using or providing non-biodegradable plastic bags, with unrecyclable packing and unrecyclable packing for their products is "extremely strong."

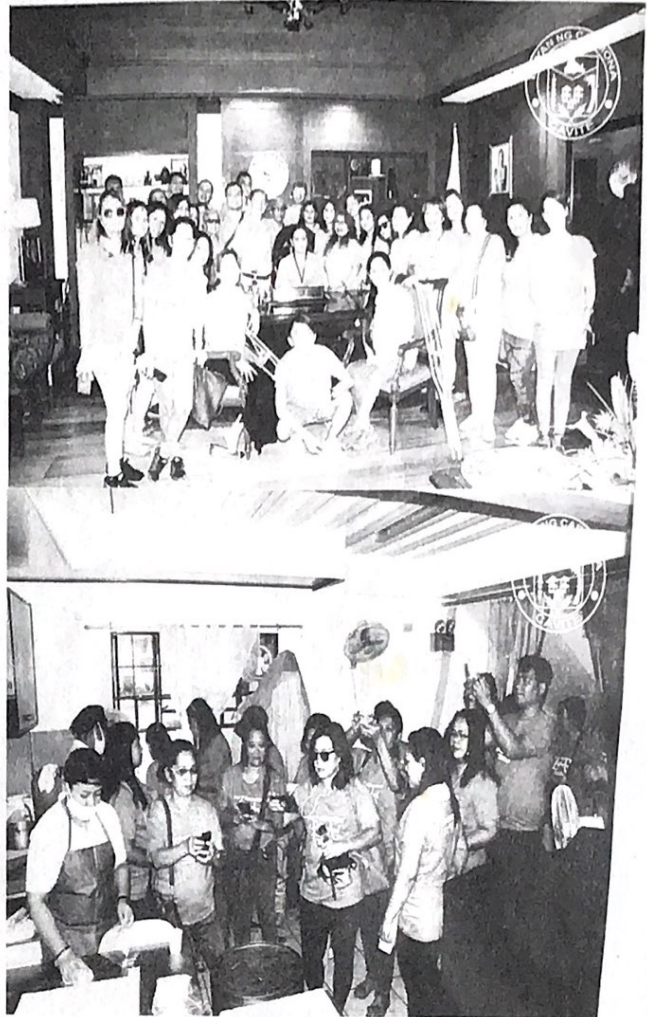

Forum on genome editing held by DOST-PCAARRD

A forum on genome editing, its applications on agriculture, and global trends was held on November 19, 2018 at DOST-PCAARRD.

The forum was hosted by the Philippine Council for Agriculture, Aquatic and Natural Resources Research and Development of the Department of Science and Technology (DOST-PCAARRD) in partnership with the University of the Philippines Los Baños (UPLB) and CropLife Asia.

Four experts on genome editing from local and international organizations facilitated the forum. They presented their research results on functional genomics and molecular breeding and discussed updates on global policy.

Dr. Leila C. Ameri-

Director of the Forestry and Environment Research Division (FERD) and Officer-in-Charge of DOST-PCAARRD, delivered the opening remarks on behalf of PCAARRD Acting Executive Director Dr. Reynaldo V. Eboras.
