387 Entries Competing in DOST-NCR's Inventions Contest

It will be a showcase of the most innovative and sustainable ideas in the National Capital Region as 387 entries vie for top prizes in the 2019 Regional Invention Contest and Exhibits (RICE-NCR), which will be held on November 6-8, 2019 at the Technological Institute of the Philippines, Quezon City campus.

RICE is a biennial event of DOST, through its Regional Offices and the Technology Application and Promotion Institute (TAPI), showcasing the works of Filipino inventors and researchers. The winners in the regional levels will advance to the National Invention Contest and Exhibits (NICE) which is held in the following year.

This year's RICE, which carries the theme "Inventions and Innovations for Sustainable Development", has drawn the most number of participants to date in all the years that DOST-NCR has held the competition. The 387 entries from 80 institutions represent a 65% increase from the 2017 RICE-NCR where a total of 251 entries competed.

The inventions and researches from the bright minds of inventors, private institutions, government agencies, and the academe will be competing in the following categories: Invention (Tuklas Award), Utility Model, Industrial Design, Creative Research (Likha Award) for Government Funded Research, Creative Research (Likha Award) for Private Funded Research, Student Creative Research (Sibol Award) for College, and Student Creative Research (Sibol Award) for High School.

Eligible for the Invention (Tuklas Award) Category is any technical solution to a problem in any field of human activity which is new, involves an inventive step and is industrially applicable. It may be, or relate to a product or process and their improvement.

KALIBO, Aklan – President Rodrigo Duterte hailed the upcoming National Press Congress here, saying that the event will highlight the Fourth Estate’s collaborative efforts to foster environmental care and bolster tourism in the communities.

“May this occasion emphasize the importance of a free press and responsive local government units (LGUs) in maintaining the positive gains we have so far achieved as a nation,” Duterte said.

“I trust that the participants will embody excellence in their journalistic work as they underscore the role of the press in the service of the people,” he added.

Duterte also called on the media to personify truthfulness and objectivity in reporting “as we create a well-informed citizenry and strengthen our democratic institutions.”

“The synergy between media outlets and LGUs play a crucial role in nation-building. I thus

welcome this timely congress that highlights their collaborative efforts to foster environmental care and bolster tourism in our communities,” he added.

The President has been invited to grace the event as guest of honor and speaker.

The annual event, which was mandated under Presidential Proclamation 1187, declaring December every year as the Month of the Community Press in the Service of the Nation, was organized by the Publishers Association of the Philippines Inc. (PAPI) for its effort to promote press freedom in the country.

PAPI president Nelson Santos and Chairman Emeritus Johnny Dayang have also welcomed the president’s support.

Dayang enjoined student writers and bloggers to actively participate in the event as it included sessions that will enhance their writing skills and professionalism, generate goodwill with the working press, and widen their perspective and knowledge in their mandate.

The National Press Congress led by PAPI, the oldest association of newspaper and magazine publishers in the country, annually gathers publishers,

editors, columnists, reporters, correspondents, photojournalists, broadcasters, including radio-TV station managers, production managers, news directors, commentators, public information officers, corporate and public affairs officers, and campus writers.

With the theme “Media-Environment-Local Governance-Tourism-Science and Technology Partnership Towards Meaningful Growth,” the 24th National Press Congress will be conducted on Dec. 3-6 here, and will cap in Boracay Island, Malay, Aklan. (RadyoT-odo/88.5FM/PN)

into Private and Government-funded sub-categories.

For aspiring inventors, students can enter their inventions in the Student Creative Research categories for College or High School. Entries here should be new and innovative projects/models that possess features and characteristics that may have significant contribution to the promotion of S&T innovations that are not contrary to public order, morals, public health, and welfare.

Winners in the 2019 RICE-NCR will be announced on November 8, 2019 and will receive cash prizes and plaques of recognition. More than the financial rewards, however, RICE provides participants with an excellent platform to show off their inventions and researches to the media and the public, as well as an opportunity to network with colleagues.

Possible technology adoptors from different industries are also encouraged to attend the three-day event.

Aside from the exhibition of the entries, there will also be various fora on topics like Design Thinking / Proposal Writing, Intellectual Property for Technology Commercialization, and Science Talk, which will be attended by selected students and teachers identified by the Schools Division Office of each city in Metro Manila.

ENHANCING TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT SKILLS OF BARANGAY TANOD

preciation to Governor Remulla for the nonstop support and took the opportunity to thank all the volunteers who contributed to the success of the outreach program. Medical, dental and technical volunteers from the Provincial Health Office (PHO) and the Philippine Medical Association-Cavite Chapter carried out health pro-

grams including consultation, tooth extraction, family planning, immunization and awareness campaign on dengue, non-communicable diseases and proper nutrition. The BJMP Calabarzon Health Services Division headed by CIN-SP Edna Leonor donated medicines while some of their officers and those of the PNP offered free haircut and performed dental extraction. Aside from the free healthcare services, giveaways such as slippers and backpacks from the Office of the Provincial Governor, emergency kits from the Provincial Disaster and Risk Reduction Management Office (PDRR-MO), and bath towels from DILG provided so much joy especially to the children. (From page 1) Children's Month in November under Republic Act No. 10661. The event aims to reaffirm the commitment of the stakeholders to respect, protect and fulfill the rights of the child, as enshrined in the 1987 Philippine Constitution, other domestic laws and rules, and international law, primarily the CRC; unpack the various rights of the child in basic education and provide a venue to deepen appreciation of these by both the rights-holders and duty-bearers in a rights-based framework of basic education; and celebrate successes in upholding the rights of the child and

identify challenges in their realization to help address them with a whole-of-society approach, including the participation of children themselves as rights-holders. "Every child, no matter how small, is a whole person with dignity and rights. We are celebrating this truth in this first national summit on the rights of the child in education. As duty-bearers, we are called to respect, protect, fulfill and promote children's physical, moral, spiritual, intellectual, and social being. Our youth have a significant role in nation-building." Under-

secretary for Legal Affairs Josephine Maribojoc explained. "Every child should have access to education, as stated in Article 28 of the CRC, and that education aims at the holistic development of children under Article 29 of the CRC," Maribojoc added. Education Secretary Leonor Magtolis Briones will deliver the keynote address in the summit. United Nations Committee on the Rights of the Child Member and Independent Expert Mikiko Otani will come over to the Philippines to discuss the CRC. Ambassador Maria Teresa Almojuela, Deputy Perma-

ment Representative of the Republic of the Philippines and other international organizations in Geneva, Switzerland, will also deliver a Statement of Commitment to the rights of the child during the summit. The participants of the conference are children and their parents, teachers and personnel of public and private basic education schools, DepEd officials from central, regional, and schools division offices, and representatives from government agencies, civil society, and international organizations.
