

# DOH CONCLUDES PROJECT WITH NANYANG POLYTECHNIC INTERNATIONAL AND TEMASEK FOUNDATION OF SINGAPORE

The Department of Health (DOH) today concluded the two-year partnership between DOH and Nanyang Polytechnic International and Temasek Foundation of Singapore to upgrade nursing practice in the country.

The project, which started in 2017, aimed to share technical expertise to 100 nursing professionals and clinical care instructors, including select officials and senior technical staff of DOH hospitals. It is the first international training program for nurses in the areas of management, mental health, oncology, orthopedics and nursing pedagogy.

“The concluded partnership was a timely under-

taking as our country gears toward the implementation of Universal Health Care (UHC),” Health Secretary Francisco T. Duque III stated, adding that the acquired knowledge and skills will be most needed at the country’s end referral and specialty hospitals.

“I extend my most sincere gratitude to the Nanyang Polytechnic International and the Temasek Foundation of Singapore for supporting our UHC efforts to build a healthier nation, and ultimately, a healthier Southeast Asian region,” Duque concluded. Source: doh.gov.ph

(From page 1) Año, the AIDIS will serve as a central repository and reporting system that will collect, store, map, and analyze data on illegal drugs nationwide.

"Through this web-based online system, we can now generate reliable data that we can use to map out our strategies and plans to further boost our anti-illegal drugs drive," he said.

The DILG Secretary said data generated from AIDIS "will also hopefully bring out the real score on the anti-illegal drugs drive and address the wrong information and figures so that the people will know that the whole-of-government is working together on the war against illegal drugs."

"AIDIS will help us tell the real story on how the government through its different drug enforcement agencies is really faring in the anti-illegal drugs drive," he said.

Año said the system will only be accessible

to authorized users from the various agencies involved in the anti-illegal drugs campaign, namely: DILG, Department of Health, Dangerous Drugs Board (DDB), Philippine Drug Enforcement Agency (PDEA), Philippine National Police (PNP), and Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD).

He said the harmonized data collected using the system will be verified and eventually connected to the Real Numbers of the Philippine Communications Operations Office (PCOO), the portal accessible to the general public and other interested parties with available internet connection.

AIDIS contains graphs, charts, and other visual representations on other aspects of the anti-drug campaign, in the form of 6 dashboards: drug affectation, juvenile offenders, operations, rehabilitation, and surrenderers.

During the AIDIS launching, the DILG, Department of Health (DOH) signed the Joint Memorandum Circular (JMC) on the Community-Based Drug Rehabilitation Program (CBDRP). According to Año, (Turn to page 4)

## 887-million sports complex to rise in Sorsogon

Sorsogon City soon host athletic events the local, regional, and national level, as the Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH) undergoes rehabilitation and expansion works on the Balogo Sports Complex in Sorsogon, Bicol.

As the largest sports facility in the Province of Sorsogon, DPWH Secretary Mark A. Villar hopes that the implementation of the project will lead to locals’ increased participation in sports events and encourage students to develop their skills in various recreational sports.

“Now that more Filipino athletes thrive in the international sports arena,

it is high time to encourage everyone, especially the youth, in exploring their capabilities and participating in sports-related events to bring pride to our country,” Secretary Villar said.

The P887 million project’s implementation, funded under the 2018 General Appropriations Act (GAA), will be divided into four phases. “We will ensure that the four (4) phases of implementation will be closely monitored to guarantee that the facilities will meet national standards and specifications,” Villar added.
