

INVESTMENT IN NON-COMMUNICABLE DISEASES PREVENTION AND CONTROL WILL SAVE LIVES AND CONTRIBUTE TO THE PHILIPPINES SAVING UP TO 4.8% OF ANNUAL GDP



Manila, 29 October 2019 – The Department of Health (DOH), World Health Organization (WHO), United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) and the United Nations Interagency Task Force on the Prevention and Control of Non-communicable Diseases (NCDs) reveal that investment in the prevention and control of NCDs could prevent the premature deaths of over 350,000 people and contribute to economic growth over the next 15 years.

NCDs, which include diseases such as cancer, heart disease, diabetes, stroke and chronic respiratory diseases, account for 68% of all deaths in the Philippines. These diseases have been shown to negatively impact on the population's health, as well as the economy. NCDs cost the national economy an estimated PHP 756.5 billion per year, equivalent to 4.8% of the country's annual GDP.

This figure includes the direct costs of NCDs associated with treatment but also the indirect 'hidden' costs arising from reduced productivity in the workplace and premature death of the workforce. The 'hidden' costs of NCDs are 9 times higher than the direct costs.

"Investing in the prevention and control of NCDs resonates well with the objectives of our Universal Health Care Law, as we are shifting our focus from treatment to primary care and health promotion programs," Health Secretary Francisco T. Duque III emphasized. "Our country's efforts on tobacco control and sin taxes will have been shown to negatively impact on the population's health, as well as the economy. NCDs cost the national economy an estimated PHP 756.5 billion per year, equivalent to 4.8% of the country's annual GDP."

Briones leads Philippine delegation, co-opens 21st ASEAN-Russia Forum on Education

DepEd Secretary Leonor Magtolis Briones led the Philippine delegation and co-opened the 21st ASEAN-Russia Forum on Education on October 21-22 held at Moscow State Institute of International Relations (MGIMO) in Moscow. The Forum, which was held under the sponsorship of the Russian Ministry of Higher Education and Science and Ministry of Education, discussed the ongoing best practices in basic, technical, and higher education in ASEAN countries and Russia. Briones was among the high-ranking officials

who gave the opening remarks. She outlined the historical cooperation between Russia and ASEAN, specifically with the Philippines, that has been ongoing without fanfare. She recalled that there were a number of big batches of student exchange to Russia in the 1960s, and that she personally knows some of the alumni of this program. The Forum likewise explored areas for deeper cooperation among ASEAN and Russia. In her speech, Briones stressed that education, among other areas, provides framework platforms of cooperation between Russia and ASEAN; however, implementation is a challenge. Secretary Briones, speaks at the Opening Plenary of the ASEAN-Russia Forum on Education. Moreover, Undersecretary Nepomuceno Malaluan spoke at the panel on basic education. He said that in-service professional development of teachers is one area of cooperation that can have the greatest impact on the quality of education. DOH REPORTS 3RD CONFIRMED CASE OF POLIO IN MAGUINDANAO

Department of Health (DOH) today reported the third confirmed polio case in the country. According to Health Secretary Francisco T. Duque III, the third confirmed case is a four-year old female from Datu Piang in the Province of Maguindanao who did not receive any dose of the oral polio vaccine (OPV). The patient was initially reported as a case of acute flaccid paralysis (AFP) last September 26, 2019, after seeking consultation at the Cotabato Regional Medical Center. Presenting signs and symptoms were fever, diarrhea, vomiting, and muscle pain.

On October 24, stool samples sent to the National Institute of Infectious Diseases - Japan tested positive for vaccine-derived poliovirus 2 (VDPV2). The polio virus isolated was genetically linked to the VDPV2 from Morogong, Lanao del Sur. Samples from another suspected case were sent for testing, awaiting results and confirmation.

As part of its polio response, the DOH will be conducting a vaccination campaign in Datu Piang, Maguindanao. This is scheduled on November 4-8 to vaccinate 4,254 children aged 0 to 59 months. Related to this, the Health Chief assured that stocks of OPV are sufficient and that preparations are underway.

The DOH, World Health Organization, and United Nations Children's Fund are set to meet with local officials of Datu Piang on October 28-29 to discuss the outbreak response.

“I enjoin all parents and guardians, to ensure that all of your children are protected from all vaccine-preventable diseases,” Duque concluded. Source: doh.gov.ph

Born in December 1965, the 53-year-old ambassador holds a Master’s Degree in World Economy from Nankai University and a Master’s Degree in International Policy and Practice from Elliott School of International Affairs, George Washington University.

Ambassador Zhao became China’s envoy to the Philippines in 2014. Prior to his appointment to the country, he was the ambassador of China to the Republic of Liberia from 2010 to 2013. PND/ pcoo.gov.ph
