

DILG lauds LGUs for move toward digital

The Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG) recently recognized the various Local Government Units (LGUs) who heeded the call of the department to go digital as a measure to fight COVID-19 as well as to improve the delivery of basic services in the new normal.

Secretary Eduardo M. Año lauded the 15 local government units (LGUs) who won in this year's Digital Governance Awards (DGA) for their remarkable ICT practices and innovations that helped deliver effective delivery of services despite the COVID-19 pandemic.

"Amid all the present trials, LGUs heeded the call of the DILG to innovate and to help us overcome the adversities of the new and unfamiliar

normal. LGUs embraced IT solutions not only to continue working and operating but also to advance strategies in reaching out to their constituents and stakeholders," said Año.

"Kayo ang nagsisilbing modelong maaaring pamarisan ng iba pang mga lokalidad. Ito ang nagbibigay ng inspirasyon sa lahat na mayroon pa ring mga paraan upang lalong mapabuti ang sistema," he said.

Año, together with the officials of the Department of Information and Communications Technology (DICT) and the National ICT Confederation of the Philippines (NICP), virtually awarded the DGA 2020 winners via Zoom conference.

DGA Winners 108 local government-led programs com-

peted in this year's DGA which were awarded in five categories namely, Best in Customer Empowerment (G2C) Award, Best in Business Empowerment (G2B) Award, Best in LGU Empowerment (G2G) Award, Best in Government Internal Process (G2I) Award, and Best in COVID-19 Pandemic Response (G2P) Award.

The following are the winners in their respective categories:

G2C category - Municipality of San Fabian in Pangasinan for its Tech4Ed centers (municipal level); City of San Juan for its Education in the Time of COVID project (city-level); and Laguna for its Project Iskolar Information System (province level).

Also recognized were the second placer in the G2C category, namely Bambang, Pangasinan, City of Manila, and Province of La Union.

In third place in the G2C category are the Municipality of Baras, Rizal; City of Cauayan, Isabela; and the Province of Davao de Oro.

G2B category - Municipality of Mina, Iloilo bagged the first place for its MAIS-FARMS; the City of Valenzuela won first place for its Paspas permit; and at the provincial level, the Province of Agusan del Sur earned a special citation for its Hatud App.

Second place awardees in the G2B category are the Municipality of Moncada, Tarlac, and Cebu City.

Third place awardees are the Municipality of Odiongan, Romblon, and Tagbilaran City, Bohol.

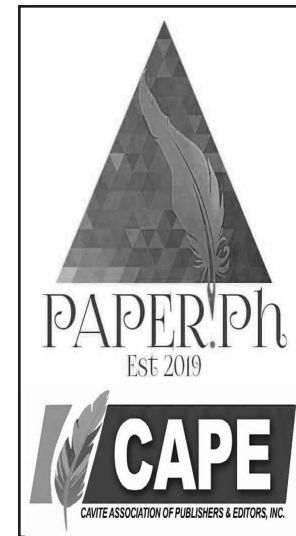

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DOH urges public to maintain commuter protocols during holiday season

Department of Health Secretary Francisco T. Duque III, with Assistant Secretary Elmer Punzalan, and Metro Manila Center for Health Development OIC - Director Corazon Flores, and Pasay City Mayor Imelda G. Calixto-Rubiano visited the LRT-1 EDSA and MRT-3 Taft station to check if the MPHS is observed by commuters in high density stations of the railway lines.

Light Rail Manila Corporation President and CEO Juan F. Alfonso led the visit for LRT-1 EDSA station and explained their strategy on how to manage commuters and to mitigate the spread of the virus.

"We only allow an average of about 375 passengers per train, which is 30% of the overall capacity per train set. We also have roving marshals who remind our passengers of the health protocols such as proper use of face mask and shield, barriers to ensure safe distancing, no talking and eating policy, and other minimum public health standards mandated by the DOH." Mr. Alfonso explained.

Año said that it is preposterous for the CPP to insinuate that LGUs are being forced to issue such declaration because LGUs are not witless and stupid puppets.

"On the contrary, they are very much aware of the situation on the ground and of the CTG's harassment and extortion

activities on businesses and ambushades and raids on government forces that has led to some 40,000 deaths of police, military, and civilians in its more than 50-year reign of terror in the countryside."

"Kaya hindi naman nakapagtataka na ideklara ng higit sa 1,500 LGUs na persona non grata ang mga kriminal at teroristang ito dahil matagal na silang nagpapahirap sa bayan at salot sa lipunan," he said.

The DILG recently announced that a total of 1,546 LGUs nationwide have declared the CPP-NPA-NDF as persona non grata in their localities. In response, the CPP released a statement saying that the said LGUs were merely forced to pass the declaration otherwise their budget would be withheld.

The DILG Secretary said the CPP's attempt to connect the persona non grata issue to budget allocation for LGUs is straight out of a teleserye narrative. "Wala na talaga silang maisip na palusot kaya

kinakabit nila ang pag-deklara ng persona non grata sa usapin ng budget para sa mga LGUs. Taktika na naman nila ito para linlangin ang publiko at matabunan ang katotohanang isinusuka na sila ng bayan," he said.

According to Año, the annual Internal Revenue Allotment (IRA) for LGUs is released and downloaded automatically to them in accordance with the provision of the Constitution.

In 2020 alone, he said local governments received more than P640-billion of funds without a single complaint from LGUs.

"Lahat ng pondo para sa mga LGU na ultimately ay para sa mga mamamayan ay nakakarating sa kanila. Yan ang katotohanan," he explained.

In fact, the DILG Chief also emphasized that LGUs received more budget this year through the Bayanihan To Heal as One Law and Bayanihan to Recover as One Law in (Turn to page 5)

Guidelines:
