

DepEd care for children's rights protection

In line with the celebration of National Children's Month last November, the Department of Education (DepEd) concluded the virtual Second National Summit on the Rights of the Child in Education with the commitment to uphold every Filipino learner's right to education.

Education Secretary Leonor Magtolis-Briones welcomed the participants of the two-day summit which happened on November 23-24, 2020, organized by the DepEd-Office of the Undersecretary for Legal Affairs in partnership with DepEd Region X, UNICEF Philippines,

Stairway Foundation, Inc., and Save the Children Philippines. "The DepEd vision states that the Department is committed to being learner-centered. Our efforts, our reflections, our projects, our hard work – are centered on the child. As a public institution, we continuously improve ourselves to better serve our stakeholders, who are the children. With the children at the center, child rights should also be at center stage", Secretary Briones stated.

One of the highlights of the summit was the "Learners' Hour – Kwentuhan Kasama si Lola Lil-"

ing at mga Mag-aaral," which gave an opportunity for learners to ask questions directly to Secretary Briones or "Lola Liling" about the implemented policies and future plans of the education agency towards upholding their rights in education amidst the current pandemic.

The Summit convened learners from junior and senior high schools in different regions of the

No final decision yet on allowing minors going to malls

The Department of the Interior and Local Government today clarified that there is no final decision yet on allowing minors to visit malls amid the COVID pandemic in the National Capital Region and in the rest of the country.

DILG Secretary Eduardo Año said that Metro Manila mayors have yet to come to a consensus and make a recommendation on the matter after two (2) meetings. He said before coming up with a resolution.

well as other health experts proposed allowing minors or children in malls and other public places, the final decision will still be with the IATF and ultimately, the President," he said.

"Let's wait for the mayors to make the recommendation to the IATF," he advised the public.

He clarified that

since no final decision has been adopted, the old regulations remain where minors are required to stay at home.

The DILG Chief said that it is better if the number of people going outside is controlled or limited in the face of the on-going pandemic although COVID cases in NCR and in urban areas in the country have been going down.

"As much as possible, we should limit the number of people going out, especially the elderly and minors; but we will listen to the Metro Manila Mayors and the health experts on what their recommendation will be," he said. Source DILG

One-Stop Shop in NAIA Terminals 1, 2 and 3

To assist Overseas Filipino Workers (OFWs) who will undergo mandatory facility-based quarantine against COVID-19, the One-Stop Shop in NAIA Terminals 1, 2 and 3 have been established.

Since the start of operations on Thursday, 23 April 2020, until yesterday, 25 November 2020, the One-Stop-Shop in these terminals have served a total of 364,320 OFWs, with 128,636 OFWs in Terminal 1, 142,804 in Terminal 2 and 92,880 in Terminal 3. The OSS assisted 80,932 Overseas Filipinos (OFs)/tourists since the start of its operations until yesterday.

The OSS is a joint initiative of the Department of Transportation (DOTr), Department of Tourism (DOT), Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD), Philippine Coast Guard (PCG), Maritime Industry Authority (MARINA), Office for Transportation Security (OTS), Manila International Airport Authority (MIAA), Overseas Workers Welfare Administration (OWWA), Department of Foreign Affairs (DFA), Philippine National Police (PNP), and the Bureau of Quarantine (BOQ) to assist OFWs in identifying possible isolation facilities where they may take their mandatory quarantine until the quarantine certificates are released, to ensure their well-being, and to prevent the spread of the coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19). OFWs may view the available spaces through the Monitoring Charts set-up at the Terminals. Information on these charts are being provided by the MIAA, PCG, OWWA, DFA, DOT, among other agencies.
