

Inter-agency veterinary mission for animals affected by Taal volcano eruption



The Provincial Veterinary Office, Cavite headed by Dr. May Magno conducted an emergency meeting for the Inter-Agency Veterinary Mission for animals affected by the Taal volcano eruption on January 15, 2020 at the Sanguniang Panlalawigan Session Hall, Legislative City. Discussed in the meeting were plan of actions that will address the condition of animals after the eruption.

In the meeting, it was confirmed that there were no reported damages and deaths of farm animals

and pets. The municipalities of Alfonso, Amadeo, Indang, Mendez, Silang and Tagaytay were identified as priority areas for the inter-agency veterinary mission based on the initial damage report submitted by cities and municipalities. Grasses and forages used as feeds in the said towns were all covered with volcanic ash posing imminent feeds shortage. Partner agencies committed to provide veterinary supplies, medicines, animal feeds, logistics and other needs that may be needed in the mission.

Present during the meeting were representatives from the Bureau of Animal Industry (BAI), Department of Agriculture Region 4-A/Agricultural Production and Coordination Office (APCO), city veterinarians and municipal agriculturists, Cavite Provincial Disaster and Risk Reduction and Management Office and the Provincial Information and Community Affairs Department. Philippine Government of Cavite assist Batangueños after Taal volcano explosion

Following the catastrophic phreatic explosion of Taal volcano on Sunday, January 12 severely affecting thousands of Batangas residents, the province of Cavite opened its doors to displaced families fleeing for safety.

Although also affected by the heavy ashfall coming from the volcano, several LGUs in Cavite, initially Tagaytay City, the towns of Alfonso, Mendez, Amadeo and Gen. Aguirre offered temporary shelter and care to families and facilitated the distribution of E-Balde to families in Batangas.



As waves of evacuees continue to come in, other LGUs have also provided shelter and help to affected families.

The Provincial Government of Cavite on January 13, 2020 organized and facilitated the distribution of E-Balde to families in Batangas.

(From page 1) ies leading to it. Atty. Juan Miguel T. Cuna of the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR), ground commander of the Manila Bay Task Force, reported that there has been a notable decrease in the fecal coliform content of the water Manila Bay indicative its improving quality. Moreover, he reported that dredging of esteros has already began and that solid waste in the waterways leading to it, as well as on the surface of the bay, have been reduced significantly. Nonetheless, Cong. Pidi emphasized that despite the mentioned improvements, a 'long-term solution' should still be sought and this is only possible if one is to prioritize the resettlement of the informal settlers along the bay. Usec. Epimaco V. Densing III of the Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG) agreed as he pointed out that 80 percent of the pollution in Manila Bay comes from informal-settler families. Hence, as the chairman of the House Committee on Natural Resources, Cong. Pidi requested the National Housing Authority (NHA) start to coordinate with concerned Local Government Units (LGUs) in order to have an accurate gauge of the number of families that have to be relocated so an estimate of the needed budget for it be proposed in the 2021 National Budget. Concerned LGUs' executives are expected to appear in the next scheduled committee hearing. Cong. Pidi concluded the committee hearing saying, "We should be proactive enough to have concrete results before our term ends."

The battle for Manila Bay, if successful, would give hope to other rivers, streams, and bays humans have polluted. Hence, Cong. Pidi urged all concerned units to present more detailed reports of their accomplishments. These include reports on the setting up of Sewerage Treatment Plants (STP) by Metropolitan Waterworks and Sewerage System (MWSS), Manila Water and Maynilad and the specific solid waste management strategies to be adopted by LGUs such as garbage hauling and construction of own sanitary landfills. (From page 1) ilies in evacuation centers and temporary shelters of LGUS where the displaced Batangas residents are located. Each E-Balde consists of a hygiene kit (bath soap, shampoo, alcohol, deodorant, toothpaste, toothbrush, underwear, face towel, sanitary napkin, dishwashing liquid, detergent soap, sponge), 2 sardines, mosquito net, blanket, bath towel and water dipper all packed in a water pail. while 432 were distributed in Alfonso. Fourteen (14) were delivered in the municipality of Mendez, 58 in Amadeo, and 100 in the town of Gen. Aguinaldo. Another batch of E-Balde were distributed on January 14 wherein 80 were delivered in the municipality of Maragondon, 10 in Ternate, 280 in Magallanes plus additional 25 E-Balde in Gen. Aguinaldo and 56 in Alfonso. Relief operations are still ongoing as more evacuees are coming in to nearby municipalities. In a meeting with the heads of different departments of the provincial government, Governor Jonvic Remulla ordered the continuous monitoring of the situation as well as the condition of evacuees to be able to provide for their immediate needs. He stressed that in light of the disaster, Cavite will not turn its back on anyone and provide whatever it can for those affected. The Sangguniang Panlalawigan also convened in a special session and passed SP Resolution No. 1389-2020 declaring the province of Cavite under State of Calamity and facilitating the release of Php 15M worth of quick response fund. The provincial and other local disaster risks reduction and management offices of the different LGUs in Cavite also extended the necessary support from the onset of the explosion conducting rescue operations, transport of evacuees and other immediate response activities. Regular coordination with LGUs and partner agencies is in place for necessary actions in the face of the recent adversity.

DILG: Only 8 Tagaytay barangays covered by mandatory evacuation

The Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG) clarified news reports that came out yesterday and said today that only eight barangays in Tagaytay City are covered by its mandatory evacuation order and therefore businesses may reopen in other barangays. DILG Undersecretary and Spokesperson Jonathan Malaya said that in Tagaytay, the PHIVOLCS listed eight of its barangays as susceptible to Base Surge and Volcanic Tsunami which is why they were included in the Mandatory Evacuation Order issued by the Department as early as Monday. "Let me clarify that it's not the entire Tagaytay City but only 8 of its barangays were included by PHIVOLCS as within the Danger Zone, so businesses may reopen in other areas of the city," he said.

Malaya said that they rely on PHIVOLCS on issues like this. "We are not the scientific experts here, its the DOST. We have requested the PHIVOLCS to issue the necessary written guidance to DILG on this matter," he said. The eight barangays from Tagaytay are Bagong Tubig, Kaybagal South (Pob.), Maharlika West, Sambong, San Jose, Silang Junction South, Maharlika East, and Tolentino East. Based on the latest reports from DILG field offices, only Bagong Tubig and Sambong has been evacuated. The other barangays only implemented voluntary evacuation. Source: dilg.gov.ph

Ms. Shiela Viola Maligalig Moreno, other personnel from the Rural Health Unit and employees from the local and provincial government were present to assist in the congress. Likewise, Maragondon Mayor Reynaldo Rillo was also in attendance affirming his commitment to support the advocacy of the provincial government on taking care of pregnant women and the eradication and prevention of HIV cases in the province.
