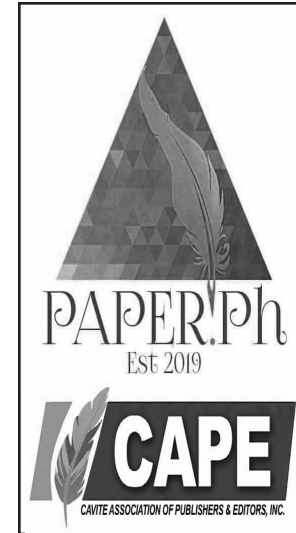

Update on COVID-19 - DOH

The Department of Health (DOH) reported that as of 12:00 NN opf March 2, there are now only 43 patients under investigation (PUIs) admitted in various health facilities. A total of 592 patients have already been discharged.

"The decrease in the number of PUIs being admitted is welcome news to all. This may be attributed to our strengthened surveillance, early travel restrictions, and enhanced laboratory processes. But this is not enough reason to let our guards down. The DOH will continuously assess the situation and improve its surveillance protocols based on evidence and further developments," Health Secretary Francisco Duque III explained.

triaties at NCC Quarantine Facility

DOH reported that 14 quarantined individuals at the New Clark City (NCC) showed signs and symptoms of respiratory illness. The PUIs manifested sore throat (10), cough (3) and fever (1) and all have been tested for COVID-19.

Among the 14 PUIs, 10 tested negative for

COVID-19 while 4 are with pending laboratory results. The PUIs are still admitted at the referral facility.

"We are more than ready to cater to the needs of our kababayans should they test positive for COVID-19. We are also geared up for the possibility of local transmission. The welfare and safety of our health workers are our

topmost priority, and as such we have adequately trained and equipped them to carefully handle positive cases should they arise," the Health Secretary said.

Global Situation DOH is adapting its contingency plans as the World Health Organization raised its risk assessment on the COVID-19 to "Very High" at the regional and national levels. (Turn to page 2)

(From page 1) followed by UAE, Hong-kong, and Singapore with two cases each. The most recent case was a 41-year old Filipina who was admitted to a health facility in Singapore. "The Philippine Government has repatriated 10 Overseas Filipinos from the M/V Diamond Princess cruise ship who were initially positive for COVID-19 and were later discharged after their recovery. President Roa Rodrigo Duterte has been personally monitoring their status, and promised the same care and protection to our other kababayans who might soon find themselves in the same position. 911 Emergency hotline receives 18M calls year 2019

Calls from the Philippine Emergency 911 hotline kept coming in as it posted 18.483-million subscribers in 2019, up from the 1.46-million calls received in 2016. According to Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG) Secretary Eduardo M. Año, the dramatic rise in calls received by E911 indicated that the public has become aware of this program that can be used for seeking assistance during emergencies. Año said the DILG had taken bold steps to ensure public safety and crime prevention. "We are happy that more and more people across the country have recognized the importance of calling E911 in times of distress and emergencies," Año said. "Growing by about 17-million calls in just three years is so enormous. However, it also comes with a greater challenge for us to raise the bar even higher in providing faster and better response to calls coursed through the E911 hotline," he also said. The E911 hotline is a community-based security and development program that provides quick response and emergency assistance to people in distress. From Patrol 117, the program evolved into E911 in 2016 through a memorandum and was institutionalized in 2018 through Executive Order No. 56 signed by Pres. Rodrigo Roa Duterte. Emergency calls coursed through the E911 include those that require police assistance, fire reports, medical assistance, search and rescue, and even those that concern chemical, biological, radiological, nuclear, and explosive (CBRNE) materials. Año said legitimate emergency calls are forwarded to the nearest Primary Service Responders and Major Support Service Responders, which in turn act immediately in coordination with the National Call Center. DepEd bats for more non-teaching staff, guidance counselors

Keen to further reduce teachers' load in school duties, the Department of Education (DepEd) is in continuous talks with the concerned national agencies to grant the needs for more non-teaching staff and guidance counselors. Education Secretary Leonor Magtolis Briones on Thursday reported on a meeting of the House of Representative Committee of Basic Education and Culture that the Department of Budget and Management (DBM) is favorably considering the request of DepEd for the adding of non-teaching items to its overall budget. For this year, DepEd was granted additional 5,000 non-teaching items but Briones hopes more slots for administrative or technical jobs will be given to the thousands of schools that the Department is managing. "It is not enough for our 47,000 public schools but it is already, I believe, a step in the right direction," Secretary Briones said.



DepEd has also reduced the number of school forms needed to be filled out by teachers to 10 from the previous 36 forms after implementing simplified school forms, and updating and reduction of data needed in existing forms. Solving the guidance counselors' supply problem. The DepEd chief also said that discussion with the DBM and Civil Service Commission (CSC) is ongoing to ease up minimum requirements to attract

Cavite resettlement site construction set to start by July 2020

The Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH) plans to start by July 2020 the construction of 8-hectare San Rafael North Resettlement Site in Noveleta City, Cavite which is a component of the Cavite Industrial Area Flood Risk Management Project (CIA-FRIMP).

The resettlement site construction which will be implemented under CIA-FRIMP Package 5 will include residential land development, road and drainage works, embankment and slope protection works, laying down of water supply pipelines and electric posts wiring, and other community facilities when deemed necessary.

According to DPWH Unified Project Management Office Flood Control Management Cluster

(UPMO-FCMC) Project Director Ramon A. Arriola III, about 470 informal settler families (ISFs) and 110 formal settler families (FSFs) that will be affected by CIA-FRIMP will be accommodated by the resettlement area.

The resettlement project is scheduled to be completed by the end of 2021, in time for the construction of CIA-FRIMP's other components which include works in nine (9) towns and cities in Cavite province.

CIA-FRIMP covers 148.8 square-kilometers of San Juan River Basin and 4.7 square-kilometers of Maalimango Drainage Area and will cost P7.1 billion funded through the help of Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA). Source: dpwh.gov.ph
