OOHCC reports 90% success rate in connecting Filipinos seeking medical attention

The Department of Health (DOH) today reported that the One Hospital Command Center (OHCC), a health-care referral network linked with service providers such as hospitals, quarantine facilities, and medical transportation, has successfully closed 2,202 out of 2,447 cases to date, indicating a 90% success rate in its ability to quickly connect Filipinos needing medical attention.

Part of the nation's response to COVID-19, or the Prevent-Detect-Isolate-Treat-Reintegrate framework, the OHCC is a centralized system that Filipinos can call prior to seeking medical assistance so that they are guaranteed a slot at an available and appropriate healthcare facility.

"The high success rate in closing cases is also attributed to the increasing COVID-19 bed capacities in different hospitals and facilities across the country, with the OHCC ensuring that the demand for beds and facilities is appropriately and adequately met," Health Secretary Francisco T. Duque III said.

"We continue to work with hospitals and health facilities to meet the prescribed COVID-19 bed allocation of 30% for public beds and 20% for private beds as set

transportation, and meals, providing them respite from their day-to-day temporary medical isolation and quarantine facilities, and expansion of government hospital capacity all over the country.

This includes P180 million that was set aside to pay for dormitories, located in COVID-19 referral hospitals, where frontliners can conveniently take a rest or sleep after their shifts.

About PHP 2.35 billion was spent on the HCW's accommodations, all HCWs who contracted

COVID-19 from February or critical illness, and PHP 1 million in the event of the health crisis.

Specifically, provisions for an infected HCW will be PHP15,000 for mild or moderate cases, and PHP 100,000 for severe critical cases.

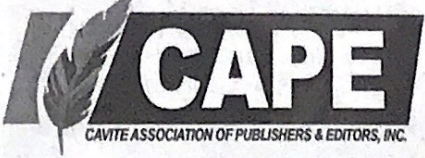

MRT-3 FIELDS 19 TRAIN SETS; NO UNLOADING INCIDENT RECORDED SINCE JUNE 2020

The overhaul of light rail vehicles (LRVs), installation of brand new airconditioning units, rehabilitation of escalators and elevators, as well as rail replacement works in the entire rail line are part of the massive rehabilitation and maintenance works being undertaken by the Sumitomo-Mitsubishi Heavy from Japan in the MRT-3, which is slated for completion in July 2021.

Meanwhile, the MRT-3 has continued its rail replacement works during the enforcement of the community quarantine period, wherein

59,250 out of 65,892 (89.92%) linear meters of rails have been completed as of 08 September

2020. With this, the MRT-3 targets to complete its rail replacement works by

September this year, several months ahead of its February 2021 target date. Source: DOTr
