

# DepEd TV episodes advised to local media

To expand the accessibility of various TV- and radio-based instructions, the Department of Education (DepEd) urged field officials to develop localized DepEd TV and Radio content to avoid duplication of materials.

“Let us not reinvent the wheel, let us not also duplicate efforts already made. Kapag nakagawa na ang DepEd TV ng episode, huwag nang gumawa ang regional offices. Sayang

panahon, sayang ang effort, at sayang ang pera,” Undersecretary for Administration Alain Del Pascua said.

Pascua emphasized the importance of tackling new topics and distributing video instructions for DepEd TV in all of the regions.

Presently, DepEd TV is concentrating on creating video content for the 5,689 Most Essential Learning Competencies

(MELCs). The MELCs are based on the K to 12 curricula and had been streamlined to 5,689 from the original 14,171. The 60% reduction is part of the Department’s Basic Education Learning Continuity Plan (BE-LCP) in response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

“Outside of the MELCs, pwedeng mag-concentrate ang ibang division at eskwelahan. Ito ay magkaiba sa gagawin ng DepEd TV. Actually, magiging complimentary at support ito [sa distance learning],” he said.

Usec. Pascua also called upon all regions, divisions, and schools with TV and radios to undertake Mother Tongue-Based Multilingual Education (MTB-MLE) video and audio productions for K-3 lessons as this matter cannot be undertaken by DepEd TV at the moment.

“The Central Office-led DepEd TV uses mainly English and Filipino languages in its episodes. All MTB-MLE videos must be produced at the local levels at this time. They can be made with new productions or the DepEd TV episodes may be dubbed using the local language,” Pascua said.

“Explore ‘yung hindi mako-cover ng DepEd TV at DepEd Radio para sa ganon, ‘yung mga output ninyo, video man ‘yan or radio, mapapakinabangan pa rin at puwede nating i-upload sa DepEd Commons at DepEd TV YouTube Channel upang magamit ng mas maraming learners,” he added.

During the recent launch of Instructional Media Centers (IMCs) by the Schools Division Office

of Pasig City, Usec. Pascua emphasized that with the collective initiatives of DepEd Commons, DepEd TV, and DepEd Radio 1,981 episodes from the first quarter to the third quarter of School Year 2020-2021.

DepEd TV, the main television-based instruction initiative of the Department, has produced 1,981 episodes from the first quarter to the third quarter of School Year 2020-2021. During the first day of the virtual In-Service Training or INSET on March 15, DepEd-ICT Service director Abram Abanil said the Department is still ramping up the production of episodes to cover all of the learning competencies

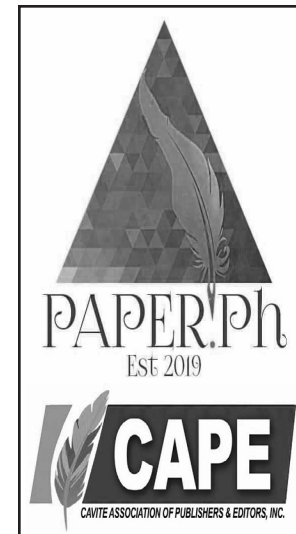

## First batch of COVID19 vaccine secured by Ph government

The Philippines national government from Monday received the vaccine manufacturer SI-NOVAC. President Rodrigo Duterte, Senator Christopher Lawrence “Bong” Go, Health Secretary Carlos D. Alvarado, and Chinese Ambassador to the Philippines Huang Xilian received the vaccine doses at Villamor Airbase in Pasay City.

“The arrival of these vaccines is great news as we are beginning to see the fruits of our negotiation efforts after months of hard work to provide vaccines for our people. This is but the first of the many other doses we have negotiated in order to achieve our goal of herd immunity,” Vaccine Czar Sec. Galvez said.

“We are expecting the delivery of around 1.5 to 4 million of the remaining procured doses from SINOVAC by April and May 2021 together with the additional 979,200 AstraZeneca vaccine doses from the WHO-led CO-

## First batch of COVID19 vaccine secured by Ph government

(From page 1) A1 to A3. Department of Health (DOH) maintains that the COVID-19 vaccine is only an added protection to our existing preventive measures such as the Intensified Public Health Measures.

The arrival of these vaccines is very timely. As we finish vaccinating healthcare frontliners, we will be able to use this new batch of purchased CoronaVac vaccines to extend vaccination to vulnerable Filipinos—or those with pre-existing conditions and comorbidities—who are at most risk of severe COVID-19 and highest chance of dying.

The remaining 24 million CoronaVac doses procured by the national government are scheduled to arrive in the following months. With the arrival of both procured vaccines and vaccines from the CO-VAX Facility, the rollout of the COVID-19 vaccination program is expected to ramp up as the government recently approved the simultaneous rollout of vaccination to priority groups.

“Even with the arrival of vaccine supplies, we continue to call for the public's cooperation in this fight against the pandemic. While COVID-19 remains a public health emergency, a great deal of caution and vigilance shall still take place to ensure everyone's protection from this disease,” Sec. Duque marked. Source: DOH

(From page 1) more than 250,000 contact tracers in the country who are doing physical contact tracing. The DILG will also hold a workshop for all other LGUs since the use of the app is mandatory.

“We recognize that we need to further intensify our contact tracing initiatives especially at this time that we have a surge of the COVID-19 pandemic. With the help of StaySafe app and the dedicated efforts of our contact tracing teams nationwide, I believe that this can help in successfully tracking down the cases and their contacts and prevent the spread of the virus,” he said.

Florece said during the MOA Signing and official turnover of the StaySafe app to the government through the DILG yesterday.

Florece said that while he appreciates the initiatives of LGUs and private companies in developing their own contact tracing systems, utilizing the StaySafe.Ph app will make it easier for government authorities and medical experts to keep track of the cases all over the country and carry out decisive actions to stem the rapid transmission of the virus.

“Hindi po puwedeng kanya-kanya tayo. We need a macro view of the situation on the ground so that we will be armed with up-to-date information that will aid us in implementing COVID-19 response policies and measures,” he said.

Present during the virtual turnover ceremony were representatives from the DILG, Multisys Technologies Corporation, Department of Information and Communication Technology (DICT) and the Department of Health (DOH)-Bureau of Epidemiology.

Meanwhile, DILG Undersecretary and Spokesperson Jonathan Malaya said the DILG and the DICT will hold a workshop for all LGUs with existing local contact tracing systems so that they can be integrated with StaySafe.

“In this time of pandemic, we cannot afford to work singly and alone, apart from the efforts of the others. Hence, we need to unify our contact tracing initiatives through the StaySafe app. We will, of course, provide technical assistance to LGUs who may need help in integrating their own systems with StaySafe,” he said.

Malaya said that Stay Safe app is currently being used by some 15 Million individual users and some 700 LGUs across the country. The DILG aims to reach at least 50 Million users and connect all 1,634 city and municipal LGUs across the country.

He assured the public that the Stay Safe app will not be used for surveillance because it does not use GPS rather it uses bluetooth technology through the GAENS or the

DENR-BMB releases study on economic value of marine turtles, blue-naped parrots

(From page 1) study will allow "more people to be inspired in conserving and protecting our wildlife." The report was released in time for the celebration of the World Wildlife Day on March 3. "We hope that in popularizing the findings, we can entice more Filipinos to think about the long-term benefits of our wildlife such as marine turtles and blue-naped parrots, and not just short-time gains," Cimatu said. The study, which was conducted under the DENR-Asian Development Bank (ADB)/Global Environment Facility (GEF) Project on Combating Environmental Organized Crime in the Philippines, aims "to recognize the bigger picture," as the protection of wildlife not only keeps ecosystems balanced, but eventually benefits human well-being. Environmental economist and study leader Dr. Agustin Arcenas said "the economic valuation of resources is vital in monitoring whether steps to protect these resources are effective, as well as evaluating the efficiency of projects and programs geared toward managing the resources, especially in situations where no other feasible metric currently exists." Based on the DENR-ADB/GEF study, one marine turtle is projected to have an economic use value of P4.80 million (estimated US\$95,900) throughout its 57-year life. This is based on its ecological role in coastal and marine ecosystems (P900,000 per turtle) and on the tourism value it generates (P3.90 million per turtle). Meanwhile, the annual use value of the entire population of the Philippine marine turtle, which is conservatively estimated at 7,294 individuals by the DENR-BMB, ranged between P2.89 billion and P3.19 billion (US\$57.88-63.85 million) per year. The study also showed that the blue-naped parrot (Tanygnathus lucionensis) is estimated to have an economic use value of P186,000 (US\$3,700) throughout its six-year lifetime. This is based on its trade value and tourism value (P5,000/blue-naped parrot when combined) and its ecological role in forest ecosystems (P181,000/blue-naped parrot). The entire Philippine parrot population was estimated at 8,500 individuals, according to wildlife conservation group Katala Foundation. Its annual use value ranged between P36.23 million and P295.19 million (US\$724,500-5.90 million) per year. Complementing the study findings, a willingness to pay survey was conducted in Cebu and Manila by the DENR-ADB/GEF Project to estimate the non-use value of marine turtles and blue-naped parrots. It amounted to an annual value of P9.30 billion for the Philippine marine turtle population and P33.38 billion for the local blue-naped parrot population. This is in stark contrast to the traded value of one blue-naped parrot, which is only P5,000 (estimated at US\$100). The buying price per blue-naped parrot in Brgy. Buliluyan, Bataraza town in Palawan, is even lower at only P200 (US\$ 4.1), the study pointed out. "This just shows that when protecting the wildlife, we get more value in the long run," Cimatu said. The DENR Administrative Order No. 2019-09 on the updated list of Philippine threatened fauna and their categories clas-

sifies the hawksbill turtle (Eretmochelys imbricata) and leatherback turtle (Dermochelys coriacea) as "critically endangered" while the loggerhead turtle (Caretta caretta), Green turtle (Chelonia mydas) and olive ridley turtle (Lepidochelys olivacea) as "endangered". The same Department Order classifies the blue-naped parrot as "critically endangered". Marine turtles and the blue-naped parrot are also listed in the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora (CITES) Appendices, affording different levels of protection from over-exploitation. They are likewise included in the International Union for the Conservation of Nature (IUCN) Red List of threatened species. DENR-BMB Wildlife Resources Division OIC chief Theresa Tenazas explained that the economic valuation study will "support efforts to amend the 20-year-old Wildlife Act." "The proposed Revised Wildlife Resources Conservation and Protection Act of 2021, which was filed by Senators Cynthia Villar and Juan Miguel Zubiri, aims to increase penalties to up to 20 years of jail time with maximum fines of P2 million or twice the value for traded species," she said. Cimatu said the DENR is looking forward to conducting more studies on economic valuation for other species of wildlife in the coming years. Source: DENR
