

Lagundi and VCO studies show results vs COVID-19

The Department of Science and Technology-Philippine Council for Health Research and Development (DOST-PCHRD) announced the results of its two studies aimed to see the efficacy of Lagundi and Virgin Coconut Oil (VCO) against COVID-19.

This was revealed through a webinar conducted in celebration of the 2021 National Science and Technology Week on November 25, 2021.

In his message, DOST Secretary Fortunato T. de la Peña conveyed to the participants his hope that through science and technology, more doors will be opened to address the public health concerns in the country. "S&T is key in generating health solutions for all," said de la Peña.

R&D on Lagundi In her presentation, Dr. Cecilia C. Maramba-Lazarte, Director of the Institute of Herbal Medicine, National Institute of Health – University of the Philippines Manila, discussed the clinical trial on the effectiveness of Lagundi tablets and syrup

to mild COVID-19 cases with no comorbidities. The two-stage, randomized double-blind, placebo-controlled study was conducted from July 2020 – August 2021. One of the reasons why Lagundi was considered as treatment against COVID-19 is its multi-targeted characteristics—its substance can relieve patients with respiratory tract symptoms.

Moreover, Dr. Maramba-Lazarte revealed that the first study showed that the standard dose of

Lagundi syrup (600mg administered three times a day for 10 days) and high dose of Lagundi tablet (three times a day for 10 days) are both safe and effective in terms of clinical recovery time, modified early warning score, and global evaluation scale.

Meanwhile, the second phase of the study saw Lagundi's efficacy in decreasing mild COVID-19 symptoms, particularly the loss of smell or anosmia. It also provides relief from any discomfort brought about by other symptoms.

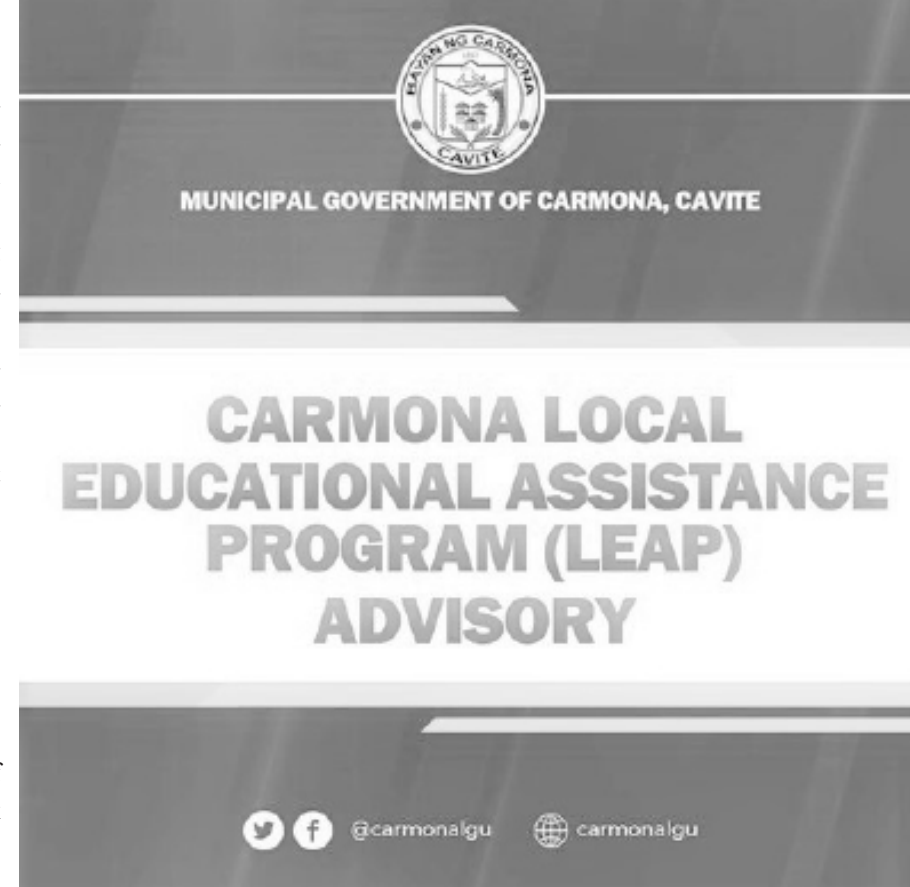

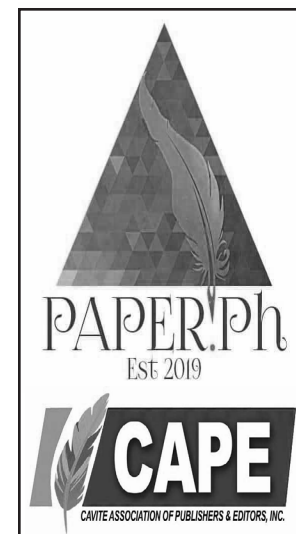

DENR proposes P181.6M budget for COVID-19 bio Hazzard waste disposal

The Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) is eyeing a P181.6-million allocation for the establishment of preliminary treatment and storage facility for coronavirus-related healthcare waste from its P774-million solid waste management program budget for 2022.

Through the Environmental Management Bureau (EMB), the DENR is planning to provide funds for 227 local government units (LGUs) nationwide representing 81 provinces and 146 cities from households, vaccination sites, and testing and quarantine facilities. DENR Secretary Roy A. Cimatu said the plan will help address the

"It is an honor to be, once again, the most trusted national government agency, but along with this are the responsibilities and duties we must continue to do to serve our learners. DepEd managed to keep the same top spot for national government agencies since the last PTI survey in 2019 due to its continued engagement with the public even during the pandemic through different initiatives to aid education. address the poor in their basic needs such as housing, food, and education.

DepEd remains engaged with the public in times of the pandemic by launching different initiatives to aid education.

In the past two years, the Department remained steadfast in providing the means to education in times of crises by tapping communities and partners and implementing the Basic Education – Learning Continuity Program (BE-LCP).

increase in COVID-19-related healthcare wastes in the country during the pandemic.

“While COVID-19 cases in the country have started to decline, healthcare wastes generated by the situation have continuously become a challenge among cities and provinces. Through this program, we hope to support LGUs in improving the collection of COVID-19 related healthcare wastes

especially in remote areas and among small generators that are not serviced by treatment, storage and disposal (TSD) facilities,” said Cimatu.

“The proposed treatment and storage facility will serve as a temporary and transit point for COVID-19 related healthcare wastes such as personal protective equipment, syringes, needles, and vials for chemical disinfection and storage before (Trun to page 4)

Build Build Chief Implementer Emil K. Sadaing; Undersecretary for Regional Operations in Luzon Roberto R. Bernardo; Undersecretary for Region IV-B and the Visayas Maximo L. Carvajal; Assistant Secretary Ador G. Canlas for Regional Operations in Mindanao; and Planning Service Director Constante A. Llanes Jr. Economic Minister Masahiro Nakata of the Embassy of Japan in the Philippines virtually joined the turnover ceremony of the masterplan.

“We are grateful for JICA’s technical capacity and expertise in world-class infrastructure for it is crucial not just in decongesting highly urbanized areas but also in achieving the 2040 National Development Plan of making the Philippines a prosperous country by investing in high quality infrastructure,” Secretary Mercado said in his read speech.

Mr. Ryuichi Ueno, JICA Study Team Leader, presented the findings on the masterplan HSH Network Development Phase 2 aimed at expanding and updating the 2010 HSH

masterplan conducted within the 200-km radius of Metro Manila, Metro Cebu, and Metro Davao.

The masterplan proposes the construction of 4,400 kilometers of HSH Class 1 composed of 406 km existing, 265 km under construction, and 3,279 km new highways to be implemented along major transport corridors across the archipelago; while about 4,600-km of HSH Class-2 (regional high standard highway) will branch off from the HSH Class-1 to provide connection to sub-regional centers, important ports and air-

ports not covered by HSH Class-1. These projects were categorized into long-term, medium-term and short-term projects based on its implementation importance. Aside from the masterplan, JICA’s development assistance also covers the pre-feasibility study of four (4) important

road and bridge namely Agusan Del Norte - Butuan City Logistical Highway in Region 13; Cebu Circumferential Road in Region 7; Central Mindanao Highway, Cagayan de Oro-Malaybalay Section in Region 10; and 2nd San Juanico Bridge in Region 8.

The project was jointly funded by the DOST through the P4,956,786.3 DOST-Grants-In-Aid (DOST-GIA) Addressing and Responding to Covid-19 through Health Research or ARCHER project and the PCHRD-GIA amounting to P489,571.20.

R&D on VCO On the second part of the webinar, DOST-PCHRD discussed the findings of its VCO study where it was found out that VCO can be used as an adjunctive therapy for hospitalized COVID-19 patients and is beneficial to suspect and probable COVID-19 cases. The DOST Food and Nutrition Research Institute (DOST-FNRI) Director and Scientist II Dr. Imelda Angeles-Agdeppa particularly pointed out the valuable effects of VCO

among suspect and probable cases of COVID-19. She called VCO as “liquid gold” with medicinal and therapeutic properties. Previous studies also confirmed that its components have antiviral properties.

Meanwhile, UP Manila College of Public Health Associate Professor, Dr. Fresthel Monica M. Climacosa said that VCO, as an adjunctive therapy, can be used together with the primary treatment or drug.

In summary, the study pointed out that with a pre-determined dose of VCO mixed on meals for probable and suspect COVID-19 individuals, it can “alter the lipid levels by increasing both the bad and good cholesterol, respectively, promote relief from acute inflammation, and can promote recovery

by resolving the signs and symptoms.”

Dr. Climacosa emphasized that although the study found that VCO could be used as an adjunct supplement to suspect or probable cases of COVID-19, but it is suggested that more studies and tests are needed to gather confirmatory evidence on its efficacy against COVID-19.

The VCO study is implemented by DOST-FNRI with partner agencies, the Philippine Coconut Authority and DOST-CALABARZON and funded by the DOST-PCHRD. 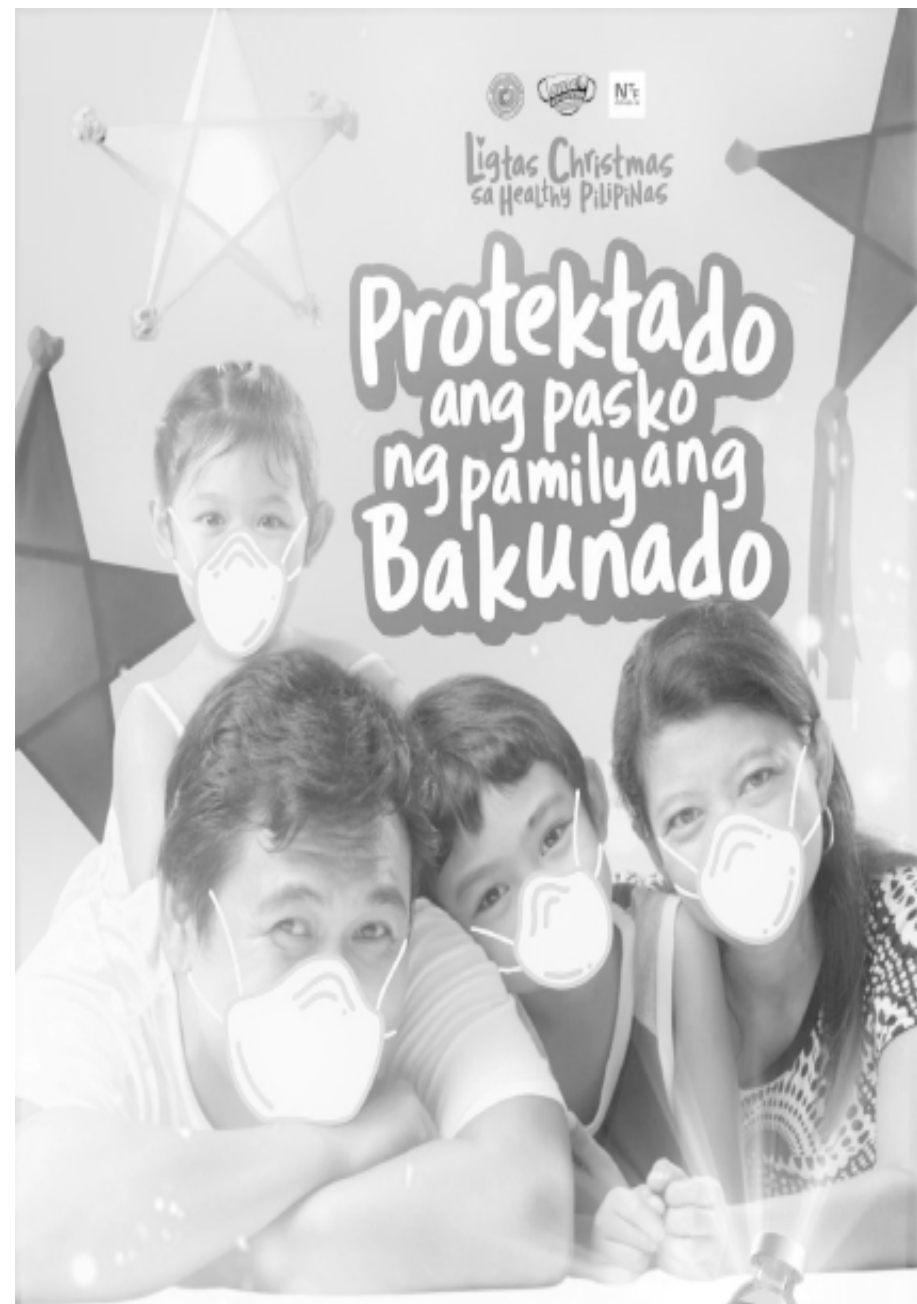

(From page 2) who sponsored the DENR solid waste management COVID-related healthcare wastes. The proposed P181.6 million budget will be coursed through the DENR regional offices. Each LGU that will receive P800,000 for the establishment of special waste facilities. The DENR, however, pointed out that the COVID-19 healthcare waste program for LGUs does not cover medical wastes coming from hospitals. Aside from the preliminary treatment and storage facility, the solid waste management program budget for 2022 will include support for the establishment of trash traps, collection and disposal services for garbage patches, provision of solid waste management equipment such shredders, composters, and plastic recycling equipment for LGUs nationwide, and hauling services for solid waste collected in Boracay. In April 2020, the DENR-led National Solid Waste Management Commission issued Resolution 1364 entitled "Adopting the Interim Guidelines on the Management of COVID-19 Related Health Care Waste" directing LGUs to develop a COVID-19 waste management plan that will adopt the guidelines on segregation and storage at source, collection and transport, and treatment and disposal. The COVID-19 waste management plan is one of the requirements for the 10-year mandated solid waste management plan of local governments. Source: DENR
