

Former janitor now cosmetic manufacturer awarded Best Setup Adoptor for Calabarzon

Henry and Apple Racaca, former janitor and sales agent, are now successful owners of the C&H Cosmetic Industry and were hailed as the agency's Best SETUP Adoptor this year. C&H Cosmetic industry is a Small Enterprise Technology Upgrading Program (SETUP) adoptor of the Department of Science and Technology (DOST) CALABARZON.

The Best SETUP Adoptor Award is given to a company that exhibits outstanding operational performance due to technology adoption and utilization of DOST's technological innovations and technical assistance. The award uses productivity, resilience, agility, innovation, sustainability, and excellence as metrics in selecting which adoptor excelled the most.

Henry shared his humble beginnings working as a janitor during the day and as a student

at night until he landed a job as a sales agent. On the other hand, Apple had a good life. But in a twist of fate, their family business failed and she was left with no choice but to pull off her abilities to make a living. Yet destiny brought them together.

Henry, who later worked as a sales agent, met Apple, a rookie in their company. They shared time as co-workers, agents of insecticide products, until such time that they found themselves falling for each other and soon decided to make a family together.

As a couple, they dreamt big and so they ventured into their own business together. Using 5,000 pesos, a fraction of the cash gifts during their wedding, they started a trading company. This venture became successful and has inspired them to embark on a brave journey of creating their own

beauty product company instead of just trading other brands. The love of Apple for beauty and skincare products served as their springboard in venturing into this kind of business.

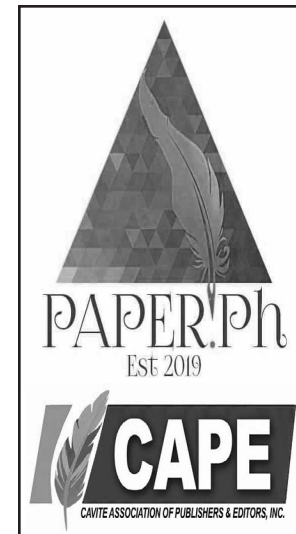
Aside from the SETUP project they availed in 2014, the firm also received other DOST services such as the Energy Audit Consultancy Program, PO Financing Program, and LIGTAS COVID-19 Program under the DOST-Technology Application and Promotion Institute.

In 2020, they applied for another SETUP project to upgrade their cosmetic line production processes and cater to a wider market. These interventions paved the way for the company to achieve 436% total increase in production volume from 2014 to 2021; 92.2% increase in sales; local and export

market penetration; improved packaging and soap cutting processes that reduced contamination risks and ensured the products' quality of the company. Significantly, the company has also reduced their production rejects from 23% down to only 2% at present. Savings was computed at around 45% for energy and about 88% for time. Meanwhile, more than 600 employees all over the country are now working for the company.

Through the leadership of the Racaca couple, the company has also developed an emergency-ready strategic plan where their business continuity plan, five-year market plan, full-year plan, risk management plan, and research & development plan were identified and linked together. With this strategy, they spun off three more companies dedicated to local, export, and online marketing distributions of their products that safeguarded their sustainability. They have co-established a US-based Extension Office at Azusa, California, to distribute their products to forty states in America.

Digital Education reaches new high with strengthened DepEd-USAID partnership

The Department of Education (DepEd) and the United States Agency for International Development (USAID) highlighted their programs for digital inclusion and gender equality in basic education during their partnership program on October 14.

"We would like to express our appreciation for USAID for thinking about our disadvantaged learners, and for upholding the rights to equal and quality

education for all Filipino children," Education Secretary Leonor Magtolis Briones expressed.

In 2020, DepEd and USAID developed 200 literacy primers and interactive e-books in 11 mother-tongue languages across the Philippines.

Upon uploading in the DepEd Commons as part of e-resources, the e-books have been downloaded more than 11,000 times by teachers and learners.

USAID has also sponsored 16 DepEd TV episodes for Grades 2 and 3, which are culturally acceptable in content, and formulated to promote gender fairness and gender equality. For this year, USAID is planning to sponsor 16 more episodes from Kindergarten to Grade 3.

Henry and Apple are also proud of the local and international recognitions they received throughout the years. They are the first Filipino Cosmetic Company with HALAL Compliant Manufacturing Plant certified by the United Arab Emirates and the first Filipino Cosmetic Company with HALAL Certification in the Middle East given by Prime Certification Accreditation. They were also awarded a Canadian Health Accreditation for Cosmetics and Skincare, Best Innovative Product Award in South Luzon during the Department of Trade and Industry's Gawad SME, and the 2020 InJap Sia Outstanding Young Entrepreneur Awards Finalist.

Aside from operating as a business, the tandem of Henry and Apple also focused their mission to give back to the community through their “#Project C&H: We Care and Help” program. This program includes converting chemical drums into trash bins and benches to benefit schools and barangays in Quezon; annual financial support to Barangay Balat-Atis, San Antonio, Quezon; and sponsorship of civic programs and activities like the DepEd Brigada Eskwela in Batangas and Quezon. HEALTH SECRETARY DUQUE FINISHES TERM AS WHO REGIONAL COMMITTEE CHAIRPERSON FOR THE WESTERN PACIFIC REGION

Philippine Health Secretary Francisco T. Duque III on Monday led 37 Member States of the World Health Organization (WHO) Western Pacific Region during the Opening Session of the 72nd Regional Committee Meeting (RCM) as its outgoing chair. The WHO Member States elected the Philippines as chair during the Committee's 71st Session in October 2020. "Even though the pandemic has taken a lot from us, it hasn't taken away our drive to serve the people of this Region to the best of our abilities, and this meeting is a testament to that," Secretary Duque said addressing the Western Pacific Regional Committee. Secretary Duque highlighted updates and progress reports on the COVID-19 in the Western Pacific Region, vaccine-preventable diseases and immunization, ageing and health, and safe and affordable surgical interventions. He reported three action plans and strategic frameworks that were endorsed by the Committee: (1) Regional Action Plan on Healthy Ageing in the Western Pacific, (2) Regional Strategic Framework for Vaccine-Preventable Diseases and Immunization in the Western Pacific, and (3) Action Framework for Safe and Affordable Surgery in the Western Pacific Region. With the disproportionate impact of COVID-19 on older adults, the WHO Regional Office for the Western Pacific Region (WPRO) developed and implemented the Regional Plan on Healthy Ageing in the Western Pacific which sets out an advocacy for healthy older adults who could thrive in and contribute to society. Technical information and support for Member States to identify, reach, and protect older persons from the virus are provided by the WPRO. As response to the immunization of the Western Pacific population, Regional Strategic Framework for Vaccine-Preventable Diseases and Immunization in the Western Pacific provided a guide to both WHO and Mem-

More quality infrastructure to be built under DPWH-JICA partnership

Officials of the Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH), Embassy of Japan in the Philippines, and Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) Philippine Office held talks on Tuesday, October 26, 2021, where both parties tackled efforts to strengthen bilateral relations on building quality infrastructure for sustainable development.

In a courtesy visit to DPWH Secretary Roger G. Mercado, Economic Minister Masahiro Nakata of the Embassy of Japan in the Philippines and JICA Philippines Chief Representative Eigo Azukizawa assured their full support to the new DPWH Chief by providing technical cooperation for on-going and new pipeline infrastructure projects.

Secretary Mercado lauded Japan's continued support to the Philippines with trusted partnership between DPWH and JICA as he noted that the Department under his leadership will keep up the ties in pursuing more development projects aimed at improving transport infrastructure in both urban and rural areas and in mitigating disasters.

According to Undersecretary Sadain, in-charge of DPWH Unified Project Management Office (UPMO) Operations that handles large-scale infrastructure programs of the Department under Official Development Assistance (ODA) financing, JICA has over the years been constantly beside the Philippines in the efforts to pursue much-needed physical infrastructures for the improvement of lives of the Filipinos.

The Government of Japan thru JICA has been one of Philippines closest partners as the largest source of ODA to finance several flagship infrastructure projects in the Build, Build program of the President Rodrigo Duterte administration under DPWH implementation.

Among the DPWH UPMO flagship infrastructure projects in Luzon financed by the Japanese government are the widening from 2 lanes to 4 lanes the 24.61 kilometer (km) including ten (10) bridges of Arterial Road (Plaridel) Bypass Project between 2 and Imus River in Region 4A under JICA Loan Agreement No. PH-P253; and Cavite Industrial Area Flood Risk Management Project under JICA Loan Agreement No. PH-P266; 30 km 4 lane Central Luzon Link Expressway (CLLEX) Project from the connection of Subic - Clark - Tarlac Expressway (SCTEX) and Tarlac - Pangasinan - La Union Expressway (TPLEX) in Balingcanaway, Tarlac City and ends at the Pan-Philippine Highway PH-P274.

DPWH and JICA are also working together towards peace and development in Mindanao. JICA provided a 2 Billion Japanese yen or approximately ₱970 Million donation/grant for the design and build of 18.97 km Marawi Transcentral Road Phase 1 under the Programme for the Support to Rehabilitation and Reconstruction of Marawi City and Its surrounding Areas.

In addition to this grant assistance, JICA is also financing the construction of another 18.78 km Marawi Transcentral Road Phase 3 together with other projects to support peace building included in the Road Network Development Project in Conflict Affected Areas is Mindanao (RNDP-CAAM) under JICA Loan Agreement No. PH-P271; Flood Risk Management Project for Cagayan River in Region 2 and Imus River in Region 4A under JICA Loan Agreement No. PH-P253; and Cavite Industrial Area

Construction of the 4 lane 45.50 km Davao City Bypass Construction Project is also on-going funded
