In celebration of the Philippines was even the National Science and Technology Week #2021NSTW, the Department of Science and Technology – Advanced Science and Technology Institute (DOST-ASTI) kicks off the festivities through the "Kooha: A Social Sensing Network Application (Explore the Koohascape)" webinar.

Kooha which was coined from the Filipino word "kuha" which means to take or capture, is a photo-sharing application that enables real-time participatory photo and sensor data collection using mobile devices. Kooha is an initiative of the DOST-ASTI, developed by Filipino scientists and engineers for the benefit of Filipino citizens. The Philippines has always been one of the most active nations online hence Kooha is the perfect app for Filipinos. In fact,

But how can we benefit from this so-called "Big Data"?

Big Data is defined as an extremely large data set that may be analyzed computationally to reveal patterns, trends, and associations, especially relating to human behavior and interactions. This Big Data is then used to draw out insights and generate new knowledge and technologies that can be used across different applications in various sectors such as transportation, telecom-

unications, business and industry, policymaking, environment and health, academe, to name a few. In addition, Kooha also aims to carve out a niche for big data generation using available sensors in smartphones and external sensor devices; develop an online social network of students, enthusiasts, researchers, and citizen scientists built on the concept of sharing and mapping contributions of photographs and sensor data across the globe; empower the general public to contribute to the scientific community; and provide a medium for data scientists, researchers, and citizen scientists to make positive use of big data generated by the Kooha application. 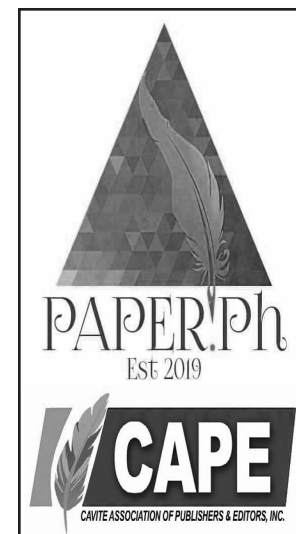

President Rodrigo Roa Duterte urged Tuesday night all local government units (LGUs), police and military personnel to work side by side for the country's three-day "Bayan, Bakunahan" vaccination program.

"I urge all national government agencies as well as provincial and local government units to use all

Governors ready to troop to Senate to protest Barangay Development Program budget cut for NPA-cleared areas

Governors and mayors are ready to troop to the Senate to protest the huge budget cut from the Barangay Development Program for NPA-cleared barangays of the National Task Force to End Communist Armed Conflict (NTF-ELCAC) in the 2022 Budget.

In the NTF-ELCAC weekly press conference on Monday, Gov. Nelson Dayanghirang of Davao Oriental, Gov. Arthur Yap of Bohol, Gov. Ben Evardone of Eastern Samar, and Municipal Mayor Eric Constantino of Abra de Ilog, Occidental Mindoro said they are ready to lead

their fellow governors in going to the Senate and they also intend to campaign against the Senators who will vote for the reduction of the Support to Barangay Development Program (SBDP) allocation in next year's General Appropriations Act.

Governor Dayanghirang said Davao Oriental was declared insurgency-free in 2013 but the communists have been trying to recover lost ground. "It was only when basic infrastructure and services through the SBDP were initiated in far-flung barangays that the local government units (LGUs)

are again winning the war against communist terrorist groups (CTGs). The people will lose their trust in the government if the promised projects do not materialize," Dayanghirang said.

On the other hand, Governor Yap said that through the years, the government has invested more than P30-billion to make Bohol a tourism destination, including a new airport and ports and they need at least P5-billion more for these much needed local access road projects that will hopefully bring farm goods to the

The National Vaccination Days, dubbed as Bayan Bakunahan, is a three-day mass vaccination drive aimed at inoculating 15 million Filipinos across 16 regions outside of Metro Manila.

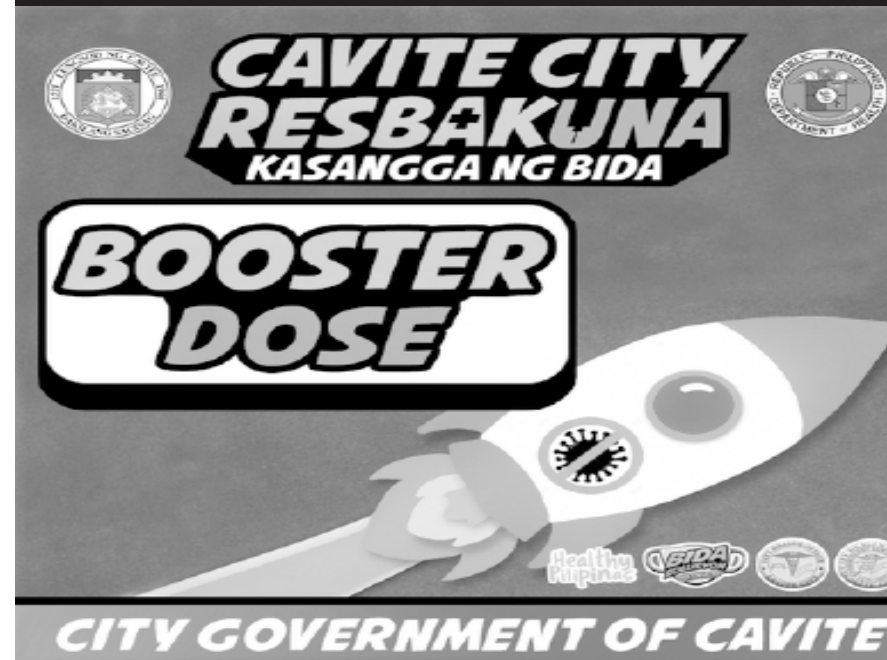
The nationwide immunization drive will be held on November 29 to December 1, which have been declared as special working days to gain wide public backing.

To prevent the people from going hungry during the Bayan Bakunahan, the Chief Executive said he would authorize all governors and mayors to shell out funds to ensure food is provided for all.

(From page 2) Occidental Mindoro are the indigenous people, organized local peace processes in their areas and now that the LGUs have gained an upper hand against communist terrorism, cutting the budget for barangay development would undermine their gains and is tantamount to sending the people back to the clutches of communist terrorists," he said.

Constantino recalled that his municipality was a hotbed of insurgency in the 1980s and the CTGs even took over the municipal hall in 1988.

Now that it is finally cleared, the communists are trying to recover lost ground to the extent that the regional headquarters of the CPP-NPA was relocated to Occidental Mindoro.

"It's very important to sustain the gains of the government now that the people have realized who really cares for them. Where the road ends, that's where terrorism begins. Where the light does not shine, that's where terrorism begins," Constantino said.

Among the proposed SBDP projects in the town of Abra de Ilog are street lights with solar-powered charging stations, potable water systems, school buildings, and livelihood assistance.

Vulnerable to CTGs DILG Undersecretary and Spokesperson Jonathan Malaya appealed to the Senate not to cut the SBDP budget from P28.1-billion to P4-billion because it will render the cleared barangays vulnerable anew to communist aggression.

According to the DILG Spokesperson, cutting the SBDP budget would be detrimental to the country's peace initiatives and campaign against communist terrorism as this would mean a very small to no allocation at all for the cleared barangays for the implementation of basic infrastructure and development projects.

"We should not go back to square one now that the endgame is near for the communist terrorist groups (CTGs). Huwag nating ipagkait ang tsansa na tuluyan nang makabangon at ununlad ang mga barangay na dati ay pinamugaran at binusabos ng mga CTGs," he said.

He said the so-called low absorption of the 2021 SBDP budget was because infrastructure projects follow a process and a timeline mandated by Republic Act 9184 or the Procurement Act but the non-infrastructure projects like the seed capital, livelihood assistance and rice harvesters have already been completed.

He added that lockdowns necessitated by COVID-19 also significantly contributed to the delay in the implementation of the infrastructure projects. Source: DILG

DENR reaffirms commitment to forest protection and climate mitigation

The Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) reaffirmed its commitment to remain at the forefront of forest protection as it welcomed the country's renewed pledges in this year's United Nations (UN) Climate Change Conference held in Glasgow, Scotland. "The DENR will be supporting the pledges and contributions made by the Philippines in the most recent 26th United Nations Climate Change Conference or Conference of the Parties (COP26)," said DENR Secretary Roy A. Cimatu.

The United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change or UNFCCC led the COP26, which took place from October 31 to November 12 in Glasgow, Scotland. "The DENR will be at the frontlines of ensuring that the verdant forest covers will be replenished to ensure adequate carbon sequestration to meet the country's contributions to sustain the goal of the Paris Agreement to limit global warming to well below 2 degrees, preferably to 1.5 degrees Celsius," he said.

The Philippine delegation, led by Department of Finance Secretary and Climate Change Commission chair-designate Carlos Dominguez with Mr. Albert Magalang of the DENR-Climate Change Service, made significant contributions to the international conference for climate change in financial and cooperative mechanisms, loss and damage, halting deforestation, among others.

The DENR serves as the Philippine lead negotiator on Article 6 (Cooperative Implementation) of the Paris Agreement and contributed to the completion of its rule book that establishes the modalities, procedures, and guidelines on how countries will exchange and transfer international mitigation outcomes through carbon credits.

Furthermore, the DENR has been regularly selected by the COP Subsidiary Body for Implementation (SBI) with countries' concurrence to facilitate the negotiations on the agenda item relating to Article 12 (Action for Climate Empowerment).

During the COP26, the Philippines was among the 141 countries that endorsed the Glasgow Leaders' Declaration on Forest and Land Use.

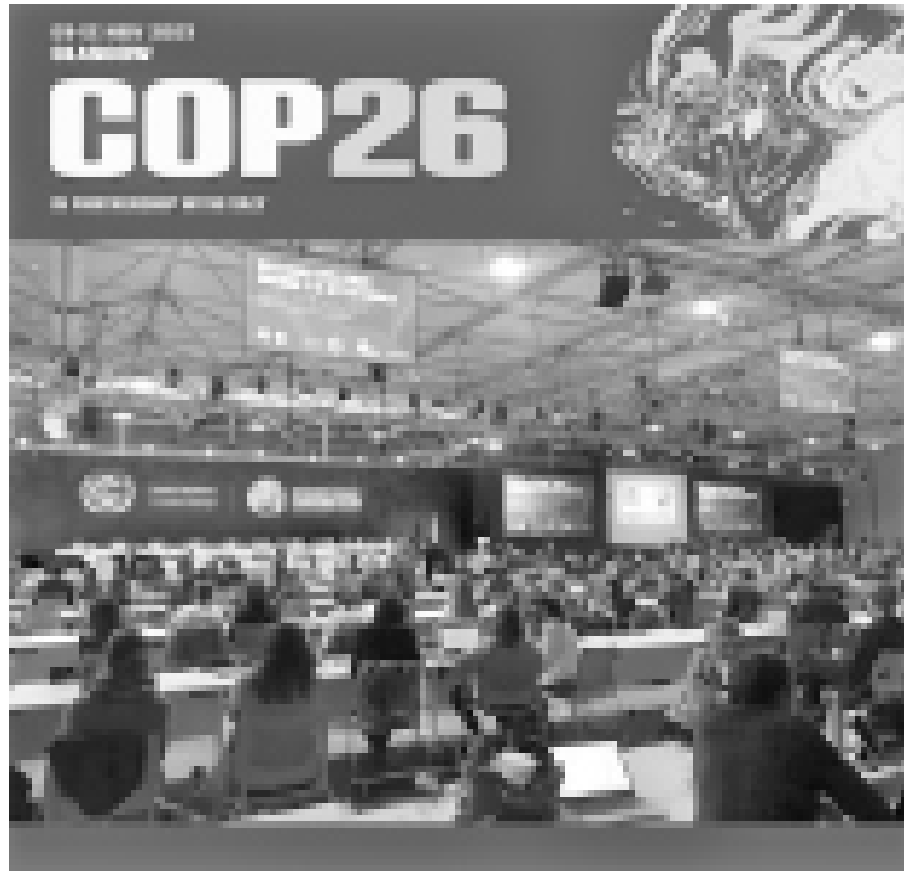
Conserving forests and other terrestrial ecosystems and accelerating their restoration, facilitating trade and development policies, and promoting sustainable development were among the actions stated in the Declaration.

The country also launched a roadmap for financing green investments which aims to encourage investments in businesses, technologies, and infrastructure and help make the economy more resilient to climate change impacts.

A new financial facility was also supported by the Philippines to address the loss and damage in vulnerable countries.

The President also reminded everyone, even those who are fully vaccinated, to remain vigilant and advised them to continue following the minimum health protocols such as wearing of masks, maintaining social distancing, and frequent handwashing.

The country has already received 134.4 million coronavirus vaccine doses through donations and procurements, and recorded 76.5 million administered doses.

Three million minors have also received the jab and third doses or booster shots have been administered to senior citizens and immunocompromised individuals.

Following successful vaccination drives, the Department of Health (DOH) reported a continuous decline in the number of active coronavirus cases in the country, noting that cases decreased by 4,000 in the span of just three days.

(From page 1) tion Program (94.27%) and Government Assistance and Subsidies (5.73%), which includes the Senior High School voucher program, among others.

The budget for the General Management and Supervision (MOOE) has also increased from P7.61 billion to P8.09 billion to fund the health and safety needs of the schools in implementing face-to-face classes next school year.

In line with this, DepEd also appropriated Php 358 million for the newly created program called the Priority School Health Facilities in response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

After the Senate Plenary Hearing, the DepEd's 2022 budget now awaits bicameral deliberations for their approval before the President. Source: DepEd
