

DSWD welcome approval of P4.1B for TCT implementation

Following the announcement of the Department of Budget and Management (DBM) on the approval of the P4.1 Billion fund for the implementation of the Targeted Cash Transfer (TCT), the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) says it will immediately facilitate the release of the 2nd batch of the cash transfers once the Department receives the funds.

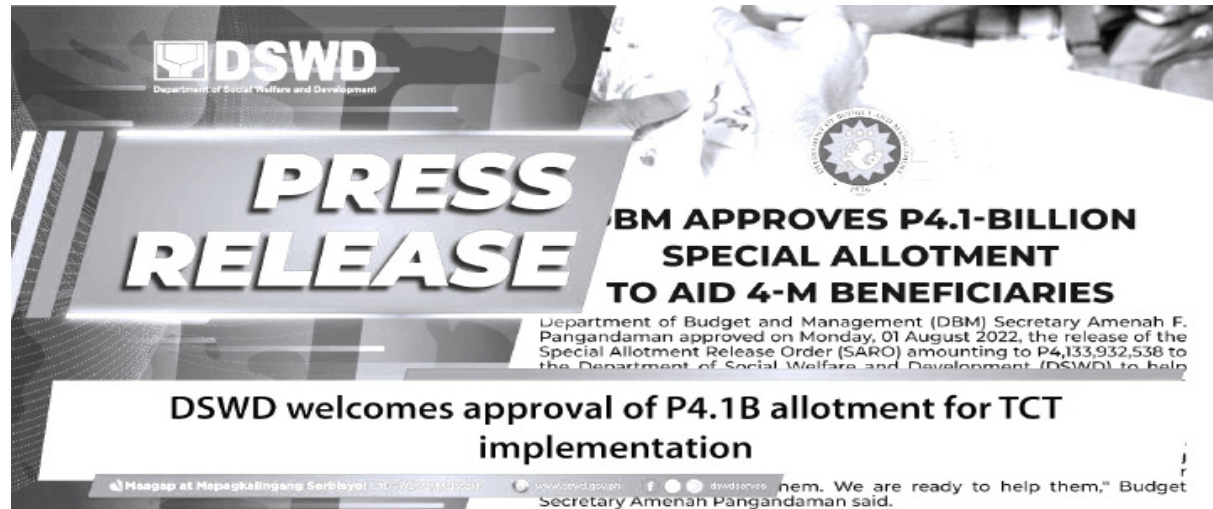
The DSWD added that the special allotment of P4,133,932,538 is a welcome development and is expected to be a significant help to the TCT beneficiaries who are most affected by the increasing fuel prices and the resulting inflation of basic commodities.

As mentioned by the DBM, the said special allotment will cover the distribution of the cash assistance to about four million families.

In June, DSWD started the implementation of the TCT program and facilitated the release

of the first batch of cash transfers to nearly 6 million beneficiaries. The Department also expresses its appreciation to the TCT Inter-Agency Committee, including the DOF, DBM and NEDA, for prioritizing the allocation of funds to continue the TCT implementation.

Aside from preparing for the second batch of payouts, the DSWD is also currently initiating the identification and validation of additional 2.4 million TCT beneficiaries through its Listahanan poverty database. Source: DSWD

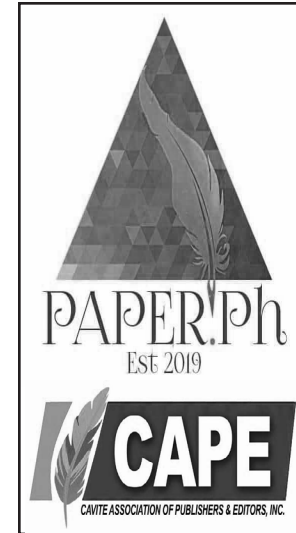

ment maintenance activities and programs in public schools prior to the reopening of face-to-face classes this year. “As a contribution to DepEd’s annual OBE Program, our implement-

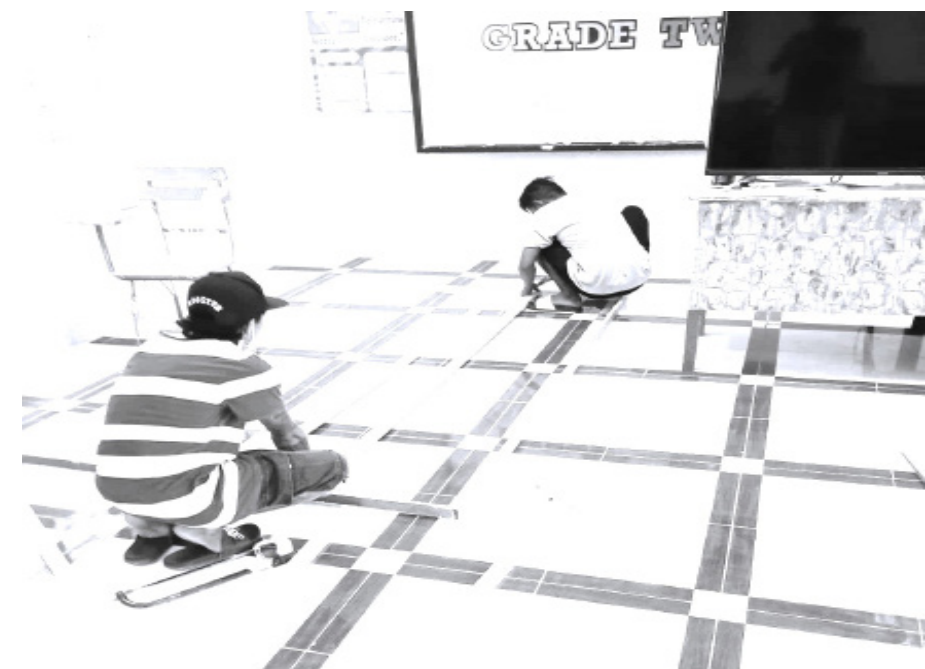
ing offices were instructed once again to undertake measures that would help in ensuring smooth and orderly opening of classes, said Secretary Bonoan. Yearly, DPWH implements

AICHR PH heeds UN statement calling for stronger anti-Trafficking in Persons effort

The Representative of the Philippines to the ASEAN Intergovernmental Commission on Human Rights (AICHR), Deputy Assistant Secretary Aileen S. Mendiola-Rau, joined the UN Senior Rapporteur on Trafficking in Persons Especially Women and Children and other AICHR Representatives in calling for the strengthening of prevention and accountability for trafficking in persons in conflict situations. The Joint Statement was released on the occasion of the World Day Against Trafficking in Persons on 30 July 2022. This is the first time that the AICHR Philippines has signed a joint statement on human rights, as part of its efforts to strengthen its advocacy of addressing trafficking in persons in the ASEAN region and beyond. The Statement, signed by individual and regional experts on human rights from different stakeholders, emphasized how conflict- and climate-related displacement put women, children, and indigenous people into greater risks, further exacerbating their current situation as the most susceptible in society. It also stressed that exploitation is a result of existing structural inequalities, rooted from poverty, inequality, cultural differences, gender-based discrimination, and weak protection system.

 While goals to address trafficking in persons have been achieved and efforts have been sustained in the past years, signatories said that much more can be done especially in protecting this particular group's fundamental rights.

"The promotion and protection of human rights must be integrated in all actions to prevent trafficking in persons, and to protect trafficked persons. It is essential to protect the rights of victims and survivors through effective identification, and gender-sensitive and child responsive support measures, with adequate and sustained resourcing," said in the statement.

Currently, ASEAN is finalizing the review of the Bohol Trafficking in Persons Work Plan 2017-2020, which is a cross-pillar action plan aimed at addressing trafficking in person in the region.

The Work Plan was developed under the initiative of the ASEAN Senior Officials Meeting on Transnational Crimes Philippines in 2016, together with other ASEAN Sectoral Bodies.

It intended to integrate regional initiatives to combat trafficking in persons in ASEAN in line with the ASEAN Plan of Action Against Trafficking in Persons, Especially Women and Children.

the diversity and high level of the technical accuracy of space missions presented. This tells me that we won't be short of space missions to pursue in the future."

The mission presentations were rated by Ms. Pangasinan, Dr. Hilario, and Mr. Felix based on creativity, technical soundness, and time management. Two (2) missions bested the rest of the proposals. These are "MIMA" or the Monitoring Illegal Mining Activities in Remote Areas by Bianca Louise B. Cruz and Oscar A. Araja II of the City of Mandaluyong Science High School, and "V-SAMS" or the Venus Seismic Activity Monitoring Satellite by Peter James Lyon and Ysabela Juliana Bernardo of Caloocan City Science High School.

The students behind MIMA explained that their satellite mission aims to protect the environment and strengthen the implementation of mining laws and regulations in the country. Based on their

proposal, MIMA would be a Synthetic Aperture Radar (SAR) satellite that could see through the cloud cover to detect changes in areas where mining activities could be present. It would use optical imagers to capture images.

The objective of V-SAMS, on the other hand, would be to learn more about the Earth's twin planet, Venus, particularly, its seismic activities. To be able to achieve this, V-SAMS would use infrared imaging to monitor the surface temperature of Venus' volcanoes, identify which ones will erupt, and discover other active volcanoes on the planet. It would also have an interferometric SAR (InSAR) to detect deformations and signs of seismic activity on Venus' surface. In addition, V-SAMS would be equipped with an optical payload to take high-resolution images.

bee On Day 2, held in person at the University Hotel, UP Diliman, Quezon City on 20 July 2022, all student campers went head-to-head at the High Tide: Space Science Contest. The participants were given 30 minutes to answer a pen-and-paper elimination test consisting of 50 questions. Lance Chrysler De Jesus of Caloocan National Science and Technology High School got the highest score in this round. De Jesus also clinched the second spot in the quiz bee finals. Lee Ramses Ibanez from Makati Science High School won third place, while Benedict Pangilinan of Navotas National Science High School won the championship.

"The space science camp team is truly grateful to our partners, resource persons, participants, facilitators, and supporters. As we prepare for a bigger camp next year, we hope everyone will continue to support PhilSA in all its initiatives," LIFT OFF co-lead Dr. James Cesar Refran said. Source: DOST

DepEd, YSEALI launches online teacher training for climate change education

The Department of Education (DepEd), in partnership with Young Southeast Asian Leaders Initiative (YSEALI), exchange alumni sets out to strengthen climate change education through the conduct of Climate Changemakers.

Climate Changemakers is the first climate change training course recognized by the National Educators Academy of the Philippines (NEAP) as part of the Professional Development Priorities of the Department.

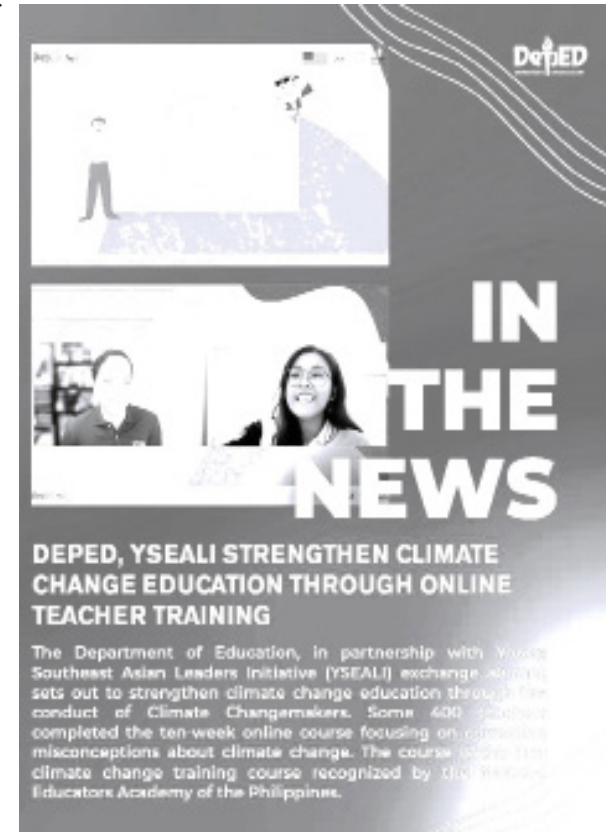
The program aims to increase the capacities of teachers to effectively teach climate change competencies, integrate climate change in competencies, and commit to climate action.

“Time is of the essence. Climate change is an emergency. The time to act is now,” DepED-DRRMS Director Ronilda Co emphasized.

Some 400 teachers completed the ten-week online course that utilized synchronous and asynchronous modalities focusing on correcting misconceptions about climate change.

It also provided a space for teachers to reflect on their learning and share challenges and good practices.

The course featured lectures from exchange alumni of the YSEALI program of the U.S. Department of State, representatives and former and present members of the National Panel of Technical Experts of the Climate Change Commission, tech-



nical specialists and teachers from the Department of Education, and climate change-focused organizations like the Oscar M. Lopez (OML) Center and Youth Strike for Climate Philippines.

Furthermore, the first batch of the training was held from November 2021 to March 2022 where the completers were trained to be mentors in partnership with the Divisions of Apayao, Sorsogon, Iloilo City, Eastern Samar, and Surigao Del Sur from the Cordillera Administrative Region, Region V, VII, VIII, and Caraga, respectively.

In addition, the second batch was opened to all K-12 teachers from public and private schools across the country where hundreds applied and completed their synchronous and asynchronous activities.

“Following the ongoing K-12 curriculum review and revision, we will also further enhance the Climate Changemakers online training course before its next release in 2023 and we hope to continue training our teachers to effectively teach climate education and ultimately answer the call to commit to climate action in the Philippines,” Dir. Co added.

Climate Changemakers is also supported of the U.S. Embassy in the Philippines, Save the Children Philippines, YGoal Philippines, Climate Reality Project Philippines, and Climate Action for Sustainability Initiative.

Touch Down Earth: Space Mission Proposals is one of the culminating activities of the three-day hybrid camp held from 19 to 21 July 2022, organized by PhilSA in partnership with the Department of Education (DepEd), Department of Science and Technology-Science Education Institute (DOST-SEI), Moon Village Association (MVA), and the University of the Philippines National Institute for Science and Mathematics Education (UP NISMED). This activity was designed to see whether the participants were able to learn the concepts from Day 1’s lectures on space missions and satellite payloads.
