

# Public and private partnership role vs disaster resilience highlighted

Philippine Secretary of the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) the Honorable Maria Antonia Yulo Loyzaga reaffirmed the Philippines' commitment to prioritizing risk reduction and climate action amidst economic and strategic challenges at the Asia-Pacific Ministerial Conference on Disaster Risk Reduction (APMCDRR).

At the Ministerial Forum held on 19 September, Secretary Loyzaga stated, "Compound and cascading hazards and fragile systems urgently require fundamental shifts towards all-hazards, whole-of-society, trans-disciplinary, and systems approaches to preventive risk governance that is inclusive, responsive, and adaptive." The Secretary is the Head of the Philippine delegation to the APMCDRR 2022 composed of

government officials and representatives from the private sector and civil society.

The Government of Australia and the United Nations Office for Disaster Risk Reduction (UNDRR) are co-hosting the APMCDRR 2022 from 19 to 22 September at the Brisbane Convention and Exhibition Centre. The Conference is the largest Asia-Pacific biennial gathering focused on disaster risk reduction, resilience, and the implementation of the Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction.

As a Panelist at the Plenary Session on Risk Informed Investments and Scaling Up Financing for Disaster Risk Reduction, the Secretary underscored that resilience is everyone's business and highlighted the role of the private sector in ensuring that resilience is a core business value. She cited

examples of corporations in the Philippines that have embedded resilience investments in their main operations and supply and value chains.

The Philippines' vulnerabilities to disasters and the progress achieved by the country in preventing and responding to disasters through robust public private partnership have been recognized by government and civil society representatives in the APMCDRR. The Philippines committed to continue to strengthen its regional engagement to ensure the implementation of Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction.

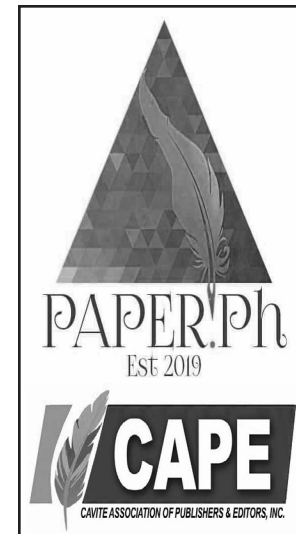

## DOH pushes for Cardiovascular Disease Prevention

The Department of Health (DOH), together with the World Health Organization (WHO), Resolve to Save Lives Federation (WHF), today staged the Heart Care Summit 2022: Preventing and Beating Cardiovascular Diseases to highlight actions needed to prevent deaths caused by cardiovascular diseases (CVDs) for 72% of deaths in the country in 2021. The COVID-19 pandemic likewise threatened the health and lives of people living with NCDs as they are more vulnerable to severe illness or death. Moreover, the WHO reported that health care delivery shifted to creating more capacity for COVID-19 patients, making health and communi-

## Crackdown on illegal businesses owned by local police and exec begins

Following his visit to the Masungi Georeserve Protected Area in Baras, Rizal, Department of Interior and Local Government (DILG) Secretary Benjamin "Benhur" C. Abalos Jr. today directed the Philippine National Police (PNP) to investigate illegal business enterprises within the conservation site allegedly owned by active and retired police officers and local government unit (LGUs) officials.

"Elected officials of the government and police officers are bound by their mandate to protect the environment. They should lead a good example to

our fellow citizens and be part of the solution, not the other way around. Tayo dapat ang nangangalaga sa Masungi hindi ang sumisira dito," Abalos said.

"We are here not to serve our interests and gain profits. We are here to serve the people," he added.

The directive came after receiving reports that active and retired officers of the PNP and LGU officials allegedly erected resorts and commercial establishments at the conservation site.

Abalos said he expects the PNP to dig deeper into these allegations

against its personnel and LGU officials and exercise due process in identifying the illegal business establishments built within the protected area. "Hindi tayo papayag na kamkamin ito ng iilang tao. Kaya sa lahat ng magtatangkang magtayo pa ng negosyo at iba pang ilegal na istraktura sa loob ng Masungi, binabalaan ko po kayo. Itigil n'yo na po ito dahil ipinagbabawal po ito ng ating batas," Abalos warned.

He stated that the 2,700 hectares of forest land should be safeguarded from land claimants

and illegal business people as the site is established as a protected area under Proclamation No. 296, s. 2011. He also referred to Section 16 of the 1987 Constitution, declaring that "the State shall protect and advance the right of the people to a balanced and healthful ecology in accord with the rhythm and harmony of nature."

He likewise said all government entities must follow the directive of President Ferdinand "BongBong" Marcos, Jr. to protect and preserve the environment against those who seek to exploit and destroy it, especially in the face of global climate change.

In his first State of the Nation Address, Marcos said "Companies who exploit our natural resources must follow the law. We all have the responsibility to preserve this Earth, for we are but custodians, and we will pass on this great treasure to future generations. There is no question that the preservation of the environment is the preser-

vation of life." Marcos highlighted the same sentiment in his speech at the 77th United Nations General Assembly in New York City, USA. On September 23, 2022, together with the forces of the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) and the PNP, the DILG Secretary visited the site to inspect and stabilize the dispute between the protected area's caretakers and armed personnel from Sinagtala security agency.

"Hindi puwedeng magtawag ng armed men in places with contested claims of land. It will create tension. Iyon ang ayaw natin. Baka mamaya, kung ano pang mangyari," he said in an interview with the media.

Abalos vowed to maintain peace and order amid land claiming in the conservation site. He already sent a letter to the security agency and warned them of possible license revocation if they cross the bounds of law in the protected area.

He also ordered the PNP to establish a permanent encampment in the protected area to prevent infiltration of so-called claimants and the protection of the people working in Masungi who have echoed experiencing threats for their work in the natural reserve.

"Kailangan po nating pangalagaan ang Masungi maging ang mga taong nangangasiwa dito. They are doing an absolutely good job kaya ating gawin ang lahat ng ating makakaya upang maisakatuparan ito," Abalos said.

On the same day, the Masungi Georeserve Foundation released a statement thanking the DILG Secretary and PNP Chief Police General Rodolfo Azurin Jr. for being "champions" who are "firmly on the side of environmental protection and the safety of its defenders."

"We will continue to advocate for peace and order and the utmost security of our citizenry," Abalos said. Source: DILG

## New technical regulations for product safety looks into Monobloc chairs

The Department of Trade and Industry (DTI), through the Bureau of Philippine Standards (BPS), has issued the Department Administrative Order (DAO) 22-09, series of 2022 providing the new technical regulation concerning the mandatory product certification of monobloc chairs and stools. The said DAO took effect on 17 July 2022, fifteen (15) days after its pub-

lication in The Philippine Star and Daily Tribune last 02 July 2022. "Monobloc chairs and stools have long been included in the DTI-BPS' list of products under mandatory certification. Since they are household staples and are commonly used in offices and public multipurpose halls, it is very important to ensure their quality for the safety of the users. With DAO 22-09,

ty services for NCDs less available.

## New technical regulations for product safety looks into Monobloc chairs

(From page 2) the tests are applicable to stakeholders to adjust and conform to the new requirements, if any.

For indoor use, the following tests shall be conducted: seat static load, back static load with balancing load, arm sideways static load, wing sideways static load, seat fatigue test, back fatigue test combined with balancing load, leg forward static load with balancing seat load, leg sideways static load with balancing seat load, diagonal base load, seat impact test, arm impact test, and drop test. Meanwhile, for outdoor use, the following tests shall be conducted: periodic weatherability test (tensile test), static load, impact test, rear-leg test, and stability test.

The Philippine Standard (PS) Quality Certification Mark Licensing Scheme shall be available to both local and foreign manufacturers selling and/or distributing monobloc chairs and stools in the Philippine market. For imported monobloc chairs and stools, the importer shall apply for either Statement of Confirmation (SOC) for PS-certified products or Import Commodity Clearance (ICC) for non-PS certified products on a per shipment per Bill of Lading/Airway Bill basis.

Product testing to determine the strength, durability, and stability of monobloc chairs and stools shall be conducted by the BPS Testing Laboratory or BPS-recognized testing laboratories. The tests are designed to be applied to fully assembled and ready for use chairs and stools. In addition, the loads or forces and dimensions in

For traceability and verification purposes as well as consumers' reference, the following shall be marked legibly on manufactured or imported monobloc chairs and stools:

Name and address of manufacturer or importer in the Philippines;

Registered trade name or brand name;

Capacity in kg;

"For indoor use" or

"For outdoor use", whichever is applicable;

Additional marking on proper handling and usage;

The words "Made in the Philippines" or country of origin, if imported;

Batch/lot no./production date; and

PS Mark with License Number or ICC Sticker, whichever is applicable

For the transitory provisions, all manufacturers with existing valid PS License shall comply with the procedures and requirements of this new technical regulation on the subsequent surveillance audit but not earlier than 17 January 2023. All pending PS applications received prior to the effectivity of DAO 22-09 shall be processed in accordance with DAO 04:2008 subject to the manufacturers' compliance with the new requirements on the subsequent surveillance audit. Meanwhile, all importations of covered monobloc chairs and stools shall be subject to the procedures and requirements prescribed in the technical

## President Marcos, Sri Lankan President Wickremesinghe Meet for First Time, Discuss Further Economic Partnerships

President Ferdinand Romualdez Marcos Jr. met with Sri Lankan President Ranil Wickremesinghe on 29 September 2022 in Manila, their first meeting since they assumed their respective offices this year.

The two leaders exchanged views on recent global events that have impacted their national economies, such as the COVID-19 pandemic and the situation in Ukraine. They also discussed

how countries should do their part in shoring up the global economy. President Marcos said that during these times, countries should actively find ways to encourage economic growth through bilateral trade and investments, addressing supply chain issues, and partnering with like-minded countries.

President Wickremesinghe expressed hope for further interactions with the Philippines and the ASEAN region. President Marcos Jr. responded that he looks forward to strengthening the relations between the Philippines and Sri Lanka through more interaction and exchanges between the two countries.

The Sri Lankan President is currently in Manila to chair the Governor's Business Session at the 55th Annual Meeting of the Board of Governors of the Asian Development Bank (ADB). Source; DFA
