

Dengue Cases sa Lalawigan ng Cavite mula Enro 1 hanggang Abril 12, 2025

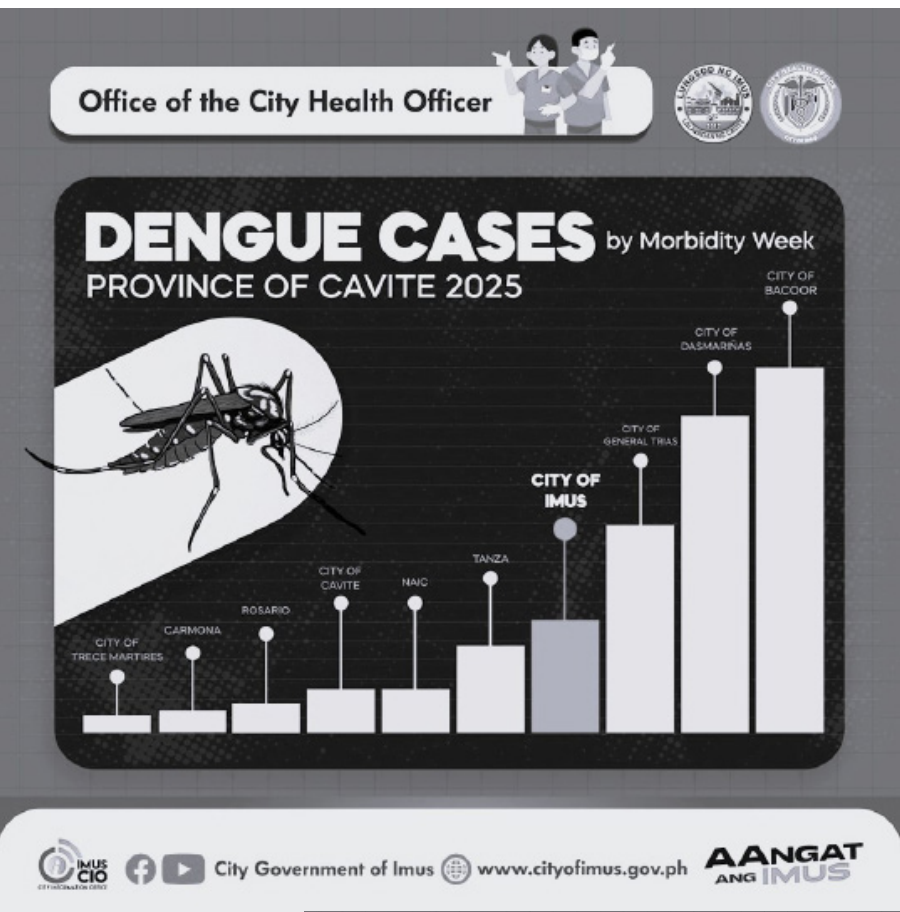
Sa pinakabagong datos na inilabas ng Provincial Epidemiology and Surveillance Unit, nakapagtala ng 4,891 kaso ng dengue sa Cavite ngayong taon.

Mas mataas ito ng 415% kumpara sa 950 kaso noong nakaraang taon.

Bagaman patuloy na bumababa ang mga naitatalang kaso sa lungsod ng Imus, maring pa ring inaabisuhan ang publiko na mag-ingat dahil mataas pa rin ang banta ng dengue sa kalusugan.

Hinihikayat din ng Pamahalaang Lungsod ng Imus ang mga Imuseño na maging kaisa sa laban kontra dengue dahil nag-sisimula sa kani-kanilang mga tahanan ang pagkakaroon ng sapat na proteksyon mula sa sakit na ito. Mag-5S kontra dengue:

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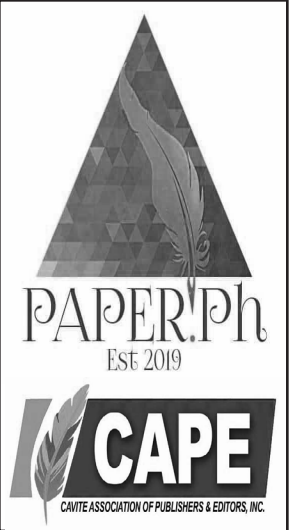

Education Secretary Sonny Angara on Monday convened the largest Executive Committee (Execom) meeting of the Department of Education (DepEd) to date, bringing together key government agencies, civil society organizations, and academic experts to deliver a coordinated response to the alarming rise of bullying incidents in schools. The meeting was called following the directive of President Ferdinand Marcos Jr., who earlier expressed deep concern over the surge in reported bullying cases nationwide. Based on data presented during the meeting, the DepEd National Capital Region recorded 2,500 cases of bullying in School Year 2024-2025, up from

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DOH Welcomes Home PEMAT Team After Earthquake Relief Efforts in Myanmar

Following their deployment to Myanmar on April 1 to provide critical medical assistance to the populations affected by the recent 7.7 magnitude earthquake that hit the country, the Department of Health's Philippine Emergency Medical Assistance Team (PEMAT) has safely returned to the Philippines at 11:20 PM on April 13 aboard a C-130 aircraft. Upon their arrival, Health Secretary Ted Herbosa warmly welcomed the team, commending them for their exceptional service during the mission. This marks PEMAT's first mission after its recognition by the World Health Organization (WHO) as a Type 1 Fixed-Post Emergency Medical Team (EMT) on September 2024. During their deployment, PEMAT established a temporary health facility in Pynmana, Myanmar, where more than 1,000 patients were provided with medical services. The services included emergency treatment as well as medical care for individuals with chronic conditions such as hypertension and diabetes. In a statement made by Dr. Ivy Lozada, team leader of DOH PEMAT, she shared that many Myanmar residents were hesitant to visit hospitals due to persistent fear of aftershocks. In addition, DOH

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Government still on track in fight against poverty, hunger amid latest SWS survey – DSWD spox

An official of the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) said on Monday (April 14) the National Government is still on track in its goal of attaining single-digit poverty incidence by 2028 based on the Family Income and Expenditure Survey (FIES) results of the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) that showed poverty incidence dropping to 15.5 percent or 17.54 million people in 2023.

DSWD spokesperson Irene Dumlaog said the Department recognizes the latest SWS survey re-

sults which was based on the perception of Filipino families and will use it as reference in the continuing commitment of the agency to innovate and further improve programs and services.

“We recognize na may magkakaibang concepts implemented through questionnaires, or the way questions were asked. PSA uses scientific indicators like annual family income and expenditures, while SWS asks for individual perception, for a short period usually a quarter,” Asst. Secretary Dumlao said in response to the latest SWS

The latest SWS survey for the period March 15-30 showed an estimated 14.4 million equivalent to 52 percent of Filipino families rated themselves as poor, while 27.2 percent said they experienced involuntary hunger in the period of three months.

"We believe that the latest SWS results is an affirmation of the work that the Department is doing as we focus on intensifying our programs to respond to the needs of the Filipino public. Ang DSWD ay committed na magcontribute para

makamit natin yung goal (MPC). ni President Ferdinand A. R. Marcos Jr para sa single-digit poverty incidence by 2028,” Asst. Secretary Dumlao told reporters at the press briefing by the Presidential Communications Office (PCO) in Malacanang.

The DSWD spokesperson stressed that poverty and hunger are social issues that have always plagued the country and this is the driving force behind the Department's continuous enhancement of programs under the leadership of Secretary Rex Gatchalian.

“The DSWD is deeply committed to contributing to the goal of President Ferdinand R Marcos Jr’s administration in reducing the poverty incidence to a single digit by 2028.” Asst. Secretary Dumlao told the members of the Malacanang Press Corps

(MPC).

Asst. Secretary Dumlao said the DSWD vows to continue innovating and enhancing programs to keep track with the Government's poverty alleviation and anti-hunger goals amid the latest SWS survey results.

With the Pantawid Familyang Pilipino Program (4Ps) as the country's national poverty alleviation program, national government agencies worked together to conduct nationwide job fairs for the graduating families of the program as instructed by the President, according to Asst. Secretary Dumlao.

The DSWD spokesperson said the job fair is just one of the interventions being implemented by various government agencies with the aim of helping families exiting from the 4Ps program to

sustain their self-sufficiency by giving them access to employment opportunities.

“DSWD has also recognized that hunger must be aggressively addressed, which is why we continue to ramp up and innovate our anti-hunger programs as we continue implementing the Walang Gutom Program (WGP), formerly our Food Stamp Program. We also recently launched our Walang Gutom Kitchen, to address the country’s involuntary hunger,” the DSWD spokesperson said.

The Walang Gutom Kitchen (WGK) in Pasay City is an innovative program which also reduces food wastage as donated surplus food from hotels, restaurants, and organizations are turned into hot meals for individuals experiencing hunger. (GDVF)

2,268 in the previous year.

“To effectively combat bullying, we need to work not just inside the schools, but also in the households and communities where our learners come from. This is not just a school matter, it is a national priority that demands a whole-of-government, whole-of-society response,” Secretary Angara said.

Law Enforcement and Community Programs
Among the immediate measures agreed upon, the Philippine National Police (PNP) committed to intervene in bullying cases

involving legal violations. Installation of CCTVs and increased police visibility will also be enforced outside large urban and high-risk schools, with strict adherence to DepEd's policy on data privacy and zones of peace.

The Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) also committed to investigate reported cases through its field offices and to establish a Parent Effectiveness Office. The office aims to educate families and address root causes such as domestic problems that may influence learner behavior.

Beyond school grounds, the Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG) proposed the activation of the Comprehensive Barangay Juvenile Intervention Program (CBJIP). The CBJIP aims to prevent bullying at the community level through diversion and rehabilitation. The Department of Justice (DOJ) supported the proposal, noting that early interventions can help prevent young learners from entering the juvenile delinquency system.

from the University of the Philippines College of Education and Ateneo de Manila University will assist DepEd in enhancing its Values Education and Good Manners and Right Conduct (GMRC) curriculum. The proposed enhancements will include integrated socio-emotional learning, emotional regulation, and conflict management. Representatives from UNICEF and Save the Children Philippines also participated, offering data and globally vetted programs to support the effort.

Additional reforms under consideration include the integration of anti-bullying policies into the Values Education and GMRC curricula, and the enrichment of the Drop-Out Reduction Program (DORP) to better address the needs of Children-at-Risk and Children in Conflict with the Law.

School Safety Policy
DepEd is also drafting a Default Policy on School Safety and Security. The baseline policy will cover physical safety measures, clear procedures for incident reporting, sanctions for offenders.

In the long term, DepEd will develop a comprehensive School Operations Manual that consolidates all safety and discipline-related policies.

Stronger Partnerships Across Sectors

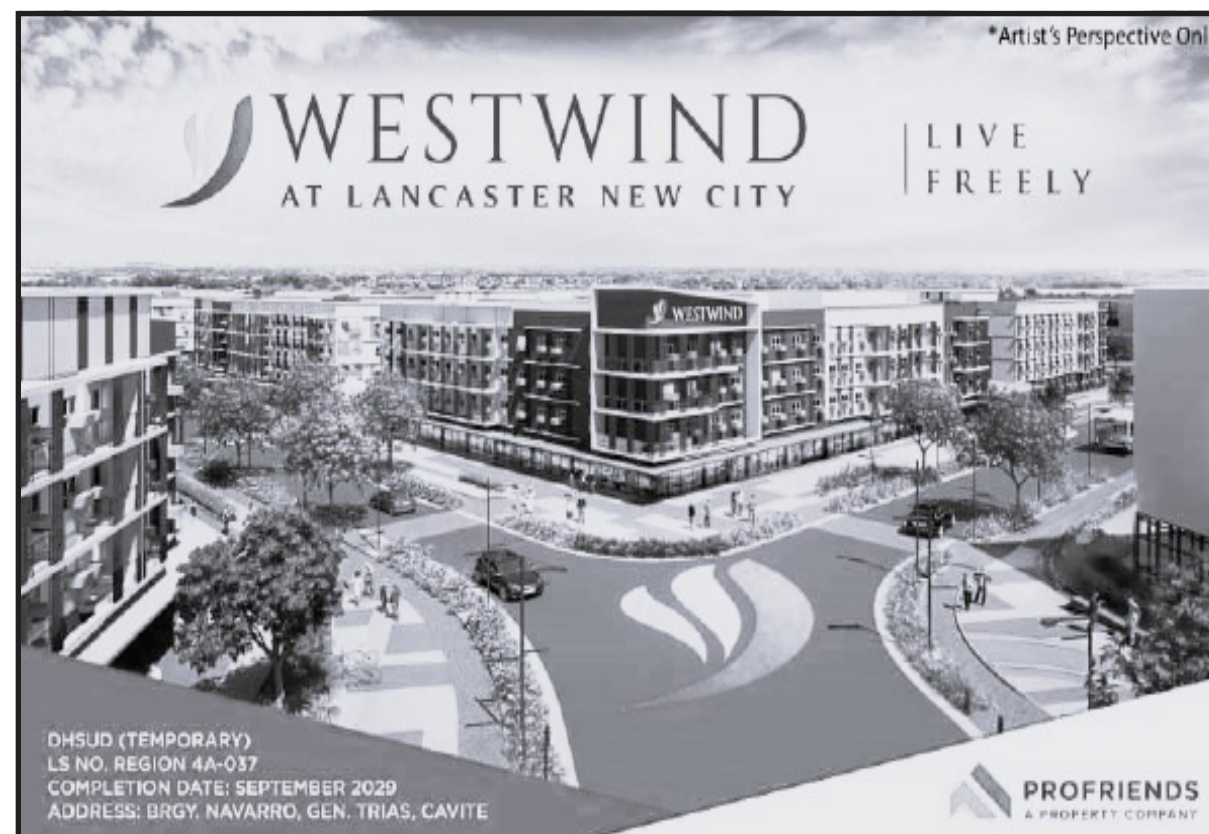
To strengthen implementation, DepEd will pursue partnerships with various government agencies and stakeholders.

These include the deployment of barangay tanods and police officers through DILG and PNP; the possible assignment of TUPAD beneficiaries as school watchmen through the Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE); and assistance from the Department of Health and medical associations in providing counseling and psychological first aid.

DepEd will also tap parents, alumni volunteers, and student leaders to assist in monitoring and implementing school safety initiatives. Coordination with local government units will be strengthened through the activation of local peace and order councils and regional and division-level helplines, in collaboration with the National Center for Mental Health.

"We must act quickly and decisively," Angara said. "The safety of our learners cannot wait for perfect conditions. What we need now is urgency, unity, and sustained action."

The inter-agency meeting concluded with a shared commitment to roll out immediate interventions while laying the groundwork for long-term, transformational policies that will ensure every school is a safe, inclusive, and supportive environment for Filipino learners. Source: DepEd

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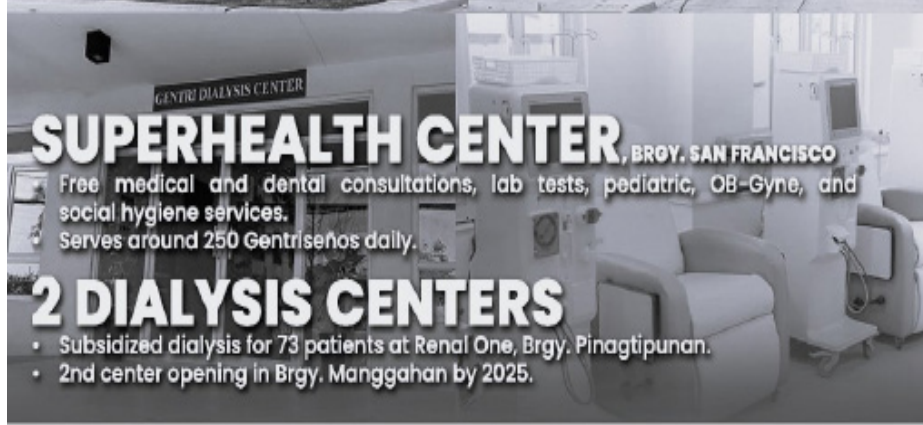

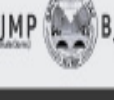

PEMAT also provided mental health and psychosocial support services for individuals severely affected by the earthquake, as part of their comprehensive emergency response approach.

The safe return of PEMAT marks the conclusion of their mission and highlights the team's professionalism, dedication, commitment and capacity to respond to crises both within the Philippines and globally.

"What we did in Myanmar wasn't just about medication, it was about

compassion and teamwork, and yung belief po na health is a human right," stated by Dr. Ivy Lozada. Health Secretary Herbosa expressed his gratitude towards the team, "You carried with you not only life-saving equipment and supplies but also the warmth of the Filipino spirit of Bayanihan: Ready heal, to help, and to stand in solidarity with those in distress."

Meanwhile, Secretary Herbosa also deployed additional experts from the Health Emergency Manage-

ment Bureau (HEMB), the National Center for Mental Health (NCMH) and East Avenue Medical Center (EAMC) to Yangon, Myanmar, in accordance to the directive of President Ferdinand Marcos Jr. to continue delivering emergency medical care, as well as mental health and psychosocial support to Filipinos there.
