

Lotilla to Global Leaders: No Nation Should Face Climate Crisis Alone

Fresh from hosting the 6th Board Meeting of the Fund for responding to Loss and Damage (FrLD), Environment Secretary Raphael PM Lotilla welcomed the advisory opinion issued by the International Court of Justice (ICJ), affirming the legal obligations of all States to address climate change and protect vulnerable ecosystems.

Secretary Lotilla emphasized the importance of unity in the fight for climate justice, stating, “The Fund was created not just as a financial mechanism, but as a testament of solidarity with those who share this burden. Together, we must amplify our voices and actions, ensuring that no nation faces the ravages of climate change alone.”

It must be recalled that last July 9, in a speech delivered on behalf of

President Ferdinand Marcos Jr. at the opening of the FrLD meeting in Cebu City last week, Secretary Lotilla quoted the latter: “Year after year, we endure the harshest blows of the climate crisis. From destructive typhoons to rising sea levels threatening coastal communities, the nation’s struggles mirror those of other vulnerable nations.”

The FrLD, established after COP27, is a global initiative aimed at assisting developing countries in addressing the adverse effects of climate change. The Fund’s pilot phase, called the Barbados Implementation Modalities (BIM), is focused on providing initial financial support through grants to developing countries.

This phase will involve developing funding criteria, a call for proposals, and support for ini-

tial projects, with the first funding commitments expected in early 2026.

Secretary Lotilla further quoted the President: “Business-as-usual is not an option when addressing the climate crisis. Every delay translates to disrupted lives and lost opportunities for thousands of families who struggle against the backdrop of a warming planet.

The cost of inaction is far too high; the moment for change is now.” In the speech, President Marcos explained that the Fund is seen as a lifeline for countries facing the direst consequences of climate change and lacking the resources to recover adequately.

“The responsibility before the Board is immense, but so is the opportunity to shape a fund that delivers real change,” he said. “With the stakes higher than ever, the Philippines will seek discussions that are urgent and impactful, shaping a fund that is swift, accessible, and human-centered, tailored to the needs of the most affected communities.”

The Philippines is set to host the 7th Board Meeting in October, this time in Manila.

“This upcoming meeting is crucial as it will likely provide significant updates on the operationalization and resource mobilization of the fund, paving the way for its initial implementation,” Secretary Lotilla explained.

Secretary Lotilla also emphasized the need for the international community to lend their support to

sustain the fund. “We call on nations to fulfill their promises of solidarity,” he

added, as he conveyed the Philippines’ commitment not only as a host but as

a dedicated partner in this global endeavor for climate justice. Source: DENR

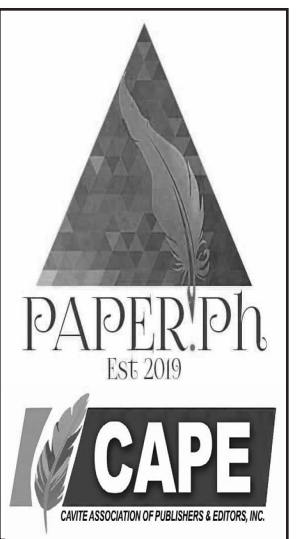

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DTI, Newport World Resorts Join Forces to Empower Filipino Creatives

PROGRESS CHECK ON MALIKSI CEMETERY FUNERAL WAKE AND COLUMBARIUM BUILDING



Mayor Strike B. Revilla, together with Engr. Jicky Jutba of the City Engineering Office (CEO), conducted a comprehensive progress check on the ongoing construction projects at Maliksi Public Cemetery.

The inspection, organized by the CEO in coordination with the City Cemetery Office, covered the Funeral Wake Room (burulan), Columbarium, and the Cemetery Perimeter Fence.

During the site visit, Mayor Strike also reviewed the status of the nitso (niches), ensuring they are properly stacked and organized. These projects aim to provide dignified and affordable burial and urn storage options, especially for Bacoor's less privileged families, while improving the overall security and facilities of the cemetery.

The city government targets to complete all construction works by the end of this year, reflecting its commitment to enhancing public cemetery services and addressing the needs of its constituents.

The Department of Trade and Industry (DTI), through the Philippine Creative Industries Development Council (PCIDC) Secretariat of the Competitiveness and Innovation Group (CIG), formalized a partnership with Newport World Resorts (NWR) through the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) at the Newport Grand Wing in Pasay City.

The collaboration reflects a shared commitment to promote and grow the Philippine creative economy through cultural showcases, capacity-building initiatives, and strengthened public-private cooperation. This initiative aligns with the objectives of the Philippine Creative Industries Development Act (RA 11904) and DTI's flagship Malikhhaing Pinoy Program. Under the MOU, DTI and NWR will co-develop and implement programs such as creative showcases, business-to-business (B2B) networking events, and performances that empower Filipino creatives and cultural entrepreneurs.

NWR has committed to providing access to performance venues, convention centers, and studios for these initiatives. “With Newport's strong push for all-Filipino casts and original works, there's a real opportunity to make theater a more (Turn to page)

Cayetano bats for ‘radical change’ in PH basic education



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Senator Alan Peter Cayetano on Monday urged the 20th Congress to pursue “radical change” in basic education — including in the K to 12 curriculum — through the 2026 education budget to address the long-standing woes plaguing the country’s education system.

“I think the task of this 20th Congress is really the radical change that is needed in the education sector... I say all of this with passion because I saw it before my eyes — kung ano y’ung successful at ano ang dumudurog sa ating sistema. The solution is there but we have to be radical,” Cayetano said on the Senate floor on July 30, 2025.

Cayetano, who chairs the Senate Committee on Higher, Technical, and Vocational Education and co-chairs the Second Congressional Committee on Education (EDCOM II), made the statement in response to a privilege speech by Senator Paolo Benigno “Bam” Aquino on basic education, highlighting systemic issues in the K to 12.

He pointed to the 165,000 classroom shortage as something that can be addressed with radical budgetary decisions.

“The 165,000 classroom shortage was mentioned by EDCOM... The Department of Public Works and Highway’s budget is P1 trillion. Do you want to end the lack of classrooms in a year? If per classroom costs P1 million, that accounts to

only P165 billion — almost half or two-thirds of the DPWH budget,” Cayetano said.

He also criticized the failed promises of K to 12, such as specialized tracks for high school students and transfer of General Education (GE) subjects from college to high school to shorten college to three years.

“The promise in K to 12, even in first year high school, junior high school, there’s already a track... Another promise is that for the GE subjects, we’ll transfer that to high school so that the colleges are promised to be cut to three years,” he said.

This was not the first time Cayetano opposed the program. In 2013, he was among the few senators who voted against K to 12.

In 2022, he reiterated his stance against the lackluster implementation of the K to 12, saying “we have to either i-suspend ang K to 12 for five to 10 years until we have enough resources, or fund the K to 12 now as it was envisioned.”

Cayetano also emphasized that the root of the education crisis lies in basic education, citing inadequate learning time, lack of facilities, and teacher shortages.

“In Metro Manila and many highly urbanized places, job matching, et cetera is still far away. Why? There are no more classrooms, teachers. Most of them don’t have tablets or Apple comput-

er labs or anything like this. Nag-additional two years ka pa (sa K to 12), pero half day ka naman sa klase. Ano iyon, diba? The problem is really much, much more basic. The bigger part of the problem goes back to pre-K to 12,” he said.

Cayetano also cited the scholarship programs of the City of Taguig where despite full financial support, dropout rates remain high due to out-of-pocket expenses.

“In Taguig, we have a 100 percent scholarship program. If you graduate from high school, we’ll automatically give you P15,000 to enroll, whether it’s for TESDA (Technical Education and Skills Development Authority) or college. If it’s a center of excellence like UP (University of the Philippines), we’ll give you P50,000. If you’re a teacher or a police officer, we’ll give you P80,000 to P120,000 to enroll for a Masters degree,” he said.

“But check our dropout rates. It’s still comparable to other places. Because our scholarship program and our full scholarship, that’s only 30 percent of the expenses. The out-of-pocket amounts to 70 percent, which is still massive,” he added.

Cayetano called on the Senate to make tough decisions in the 2026 education budget.

“Let’s make the hard decisions and put our money where our mouth is,” he said.

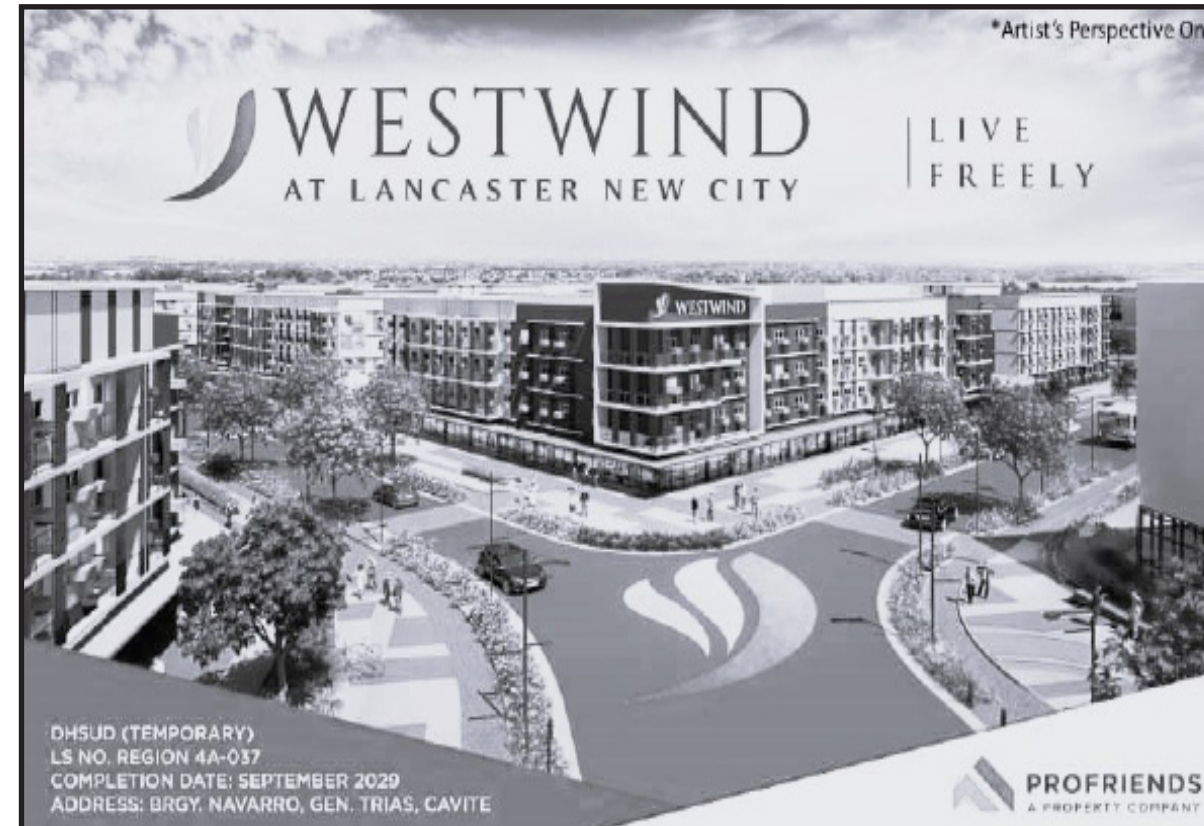

Mas Responsive na Kurikulum

Binago rin ang K to 10 curriculum para mas pagtibayin ang reading, writing, at basic math. Sa Senior High School, kasalukuyang pinapatakbo sa 900 paaralan ang mas pinalakas na curriculum na mas nakatutok sa academic at tech-voc skills.

Sa pamamagitan ng Literacy Remediation Program (LRP) at Bawat Bata Bumabasa Program (BBMP) na nilunsad nitong summer break, nakapagtalala ng malaking pag-unlad sa foundational literacy, kung saan malaki ang ibinaba ng bilang ng mga low emerging readers.

pagpapalawak ng School-Based Feeding Program, na inilunsad kamakailan. Simula ngayong school year, lahat ng Kindergarten learners sa mga pampublikong paaralan ay sasailalim na sa feeding program.

Para palakasin pa ang suporta sa kalusugan ng mga bata, ilulunsad ng DepEd ang pilot implementation ng Project SIGLA, isang digital system para i-monitor ang health at nutrition status ng mga mag-aaral. Kasabay nito, sinimulan na rin ang konstruksyon ng 328 bagong Child Development Centers sa mga pinakamahihirap na bayan sa bansa.

Pagtutok sa Kapanakan ng mga Guro

Malaking hakbang din ang nagawa sa pagpatibay ng suporta sa mga guro. Sa mahigit 22,000 bagong teaching positions

na pinondohan ng 2024, 97% na ang napunan. Sa mga administrative staff naman, 99% ng 5,000 bagong posisyon ang nalagayan na.

Nagdagdag rin ng bagong career levels (Teacher IV hanggang VII) para mas gumanda ang career path ng mga guro. Mahigit 2,100 school heads ang i-rere-classify sa School Principal positions, isang hakbang na papalapit sa target na “one school, one principal.”

Tumaas din ang teaching supplies allowance mula ₱5,000 pataas na ngayon sa ₱10,000. Unang beses ring naglabas ng medical allowance para sa mga public school teachers. Para sa mga guro sa private schools, itinaas ang salary subsidy sa ₱24,000 kada taon, o ₱6,000 dagdag.

Bukod dito, nabawasan ng higit kalahati

ang daily paperwork ng mga guro para mas makapagturo sila nang mas epektibo at may sapat na oras sa kanilang mga estudyante.

Pagtugon sa Kukulangan sa Silid-Aralan at Connectivity

Kasama ang private sector, isinusulong ng DepEd ang pagtatayo ng 105,000 classrooms para matugunan ang backlog sa buong bansa. May bagong disensyo rin ang mga modular classrooms para sa mga lugar na tinamaan ng sakuna sa darating na Agosto.

Sa tulong ng DICT, DOE, at NEA, pinapalakas din ang access sa kuryente at internet sa mga last mile schools. Sa ilalim ng PSIP Connect project, inaasahan ding makarating ang digital devices, solar power, at koneksyon sa internet sa mga paaralang malalayo sa kabisan.
