





In response to the increasing number of reports received by the Department of Trade and Industry (DTI) regarding the inaccurate updating of the status of deliveries of parcels ordered online, the DTI, through the E-Commerce Bureau (ECB), met last 07 January 2026 with Flash Express, a last-mile service provider, to discuss ways on how to prevent such incidents.

The reports or complaints received pertain to alleged unfair or deceptive practices wherein the parcels handled by last-mile delivery service providers were tagged as “delivered” despite not being received by the consignees or addressees. Further, there had been reports that delivery riders declare that they are trying to reach the consignees or addressees on multiple occasions which lead the parcels to be tagged as “return to sender” when such did not happen at all. With its mandate to protect consumers engaged in online transactions pursuant to Republic Act No. 11967, or the Internet Transactions Act of 2023, the DTI ECB engaged with Flash Express to address and clarify the reported issues.

from the general public.

Training and other extension initiatives by the DA-ATI CALABARZON primarily focused on good agricultural practices, farm mechanization, climate-resilient agriculture, smart farming, and integrated nutrient and pest management.

These programs were not limited to the production aspect, as the agency also equipped the aforementioned individuals with technologies along the agricultural value chain, including post-harvest technologies, processing, and marketing—across different banner programs like rice, corn, livestock, Coconut Farmers and Industry Development Plan (CFIDP), High Value Crops Development Program (HVCDP), organic agriculture, and National Urban and Peri-urban Agriculture Program (NUPAP), and additional extension services.

John Mark Sto. Domingo, an agricultural and biosystems engineer from Teresa, Rizal, also shared how the DA-ATI CALABARZON helps extension workers like him in performing their duties at the grassroots level.

In his impression of the Training on Testing and Evaluation of Agricultural and Fisheries Machinery held last June, he said: "This training is a great help for me to understand how procurement and acceptance testing work in acquiring farm machinery. That's why every one of us ay sobrang eager ding pumasa – 'cause it will give us a chance to evaluate the machinery that we're acquiring more thoroughly. Because in the end, we want our farmers to receive those interventions na up-to-standards and

fit talaga sa kung ano ang needs nila."

Moreover, social technologies, including training facilitation and management, and extension communication, were also imparted to participants, especially AEWs, farmer-leaders, and farm cooperators.

These accomplishments reflect the unwavering dedication of the DA-ATI CALABARZON in empowering its stakeholders through a resilient and responsive agriculture and fisheries extension system in the region.

Meanwhile, Dr. Rolando Maningas, Center Director of the DA-ATI CALABARZON, shared a glimpse of the agency's plans as it gears towards 2026.

"For 2026, we will solidify our efforts to modernize and mechanize the agri-fishery sector by reinforcing technologies, innovations, quality extension services, inclusivity, and skills-based trainings that respond to the evolving needs of our farmers and fishers," said Dr. Maningas.

He added, "At the same time, we will strengthen our role as a nexus in empowering and catalyzing our extension workers as key change agents in the region, ensuring that our services and their impacts are met on the ground and will truly lead to 'masaganang agrikultura at maunlad na ekonomiya.'" DSWD Steps Up Assistance as Mayon Volcano Remains on Alert Level 3

Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) Secretary Rex Gatchalian visits the Bicol Region today (January 8) to oversee the ongoing disaster response operations following the escalating restiveness of Mayon Volcano, with Alert Level 3 being raised by the Philippine Institute of Volcanology and Seismology (PHIVOLCS).

The DSWD chief's visit aims to ensure that the Department's response mechanisms are fully activated, resources are readily available and that the assistance provided to affected families is timely and adequate.

Secretary Gatchalian is on his way to Albay province to check the situation of the families who have sought temporary

shelter in evacuation centers.

"First domestic trip for 2026 --- Albay bound to check on the preemptive evacuations because of the Mayon unrest," Secretary Rex said in a Facebook post early Thursday (January 08).

Asst. Secretary Irene Dumlaog of the DSWD's Disaster Response Management Group (DRMG) stressed that Secretary Gatchalian wants to ensure that the Field Office 5 - Bicol Region is prepared for any eventuality.

"The Secretary is on his way to Bicol para makita kung maayos ang takbo ng disaster response ng DSWD Field Office sa Bicol, tinitingnan kung sapat ang family food packs, operational ang mobile kitchens at wa-

ter stations, at siguradong ready ang lahat ng resources para sa mga apektadong pamilya," Asst. Secretary Dumlaog, who is also the DSWD spokesperson, said on Thursday (January 08).

Secretary Gatchalian will be holding coordination meetings with provincial governors and city and municipal mayors to assess the situation on the ground, identify the resources needed for augmentation support and strengthen inter-agency and local government response.

The DSWD chief will also oversee the distribution of family food packs (FFPs) and hygiene kits to displaced families inside evacuation centers, according to Asst. Secretary Dumlaog.
