

Philippine Mangoes Enter Canadian Market Through First Commercial Export Shipment

The Department of Trade and Industry (DTI), through the Philippine Trade and Investment Center in Toronto (PTIC-Toronto) and the Export Marketing Bureau (DTI-EMB), welcomed the successful arrival of the first commercial export shipment of fresh Philippine mangoes to Canada on 04 June 2026, marking a significant milestone in expanding the presence of Philippine agricultural products in the Canadian market. The shipment, brought together stakeholders from the DTI, Department of Agriculture (DA), Department of Foreign Affairs (DFA), PAL, and Hi-Las Marketing Corporation, arrived following the ceremonial send-off held on 03 June 2026 at the Philippine Airlines (PAL) Cargo facility in Pasay City, reflects the collaborative efforts of government agencies and industry partners to establish a sustainable export pathway for fresh Philippine mangoes. 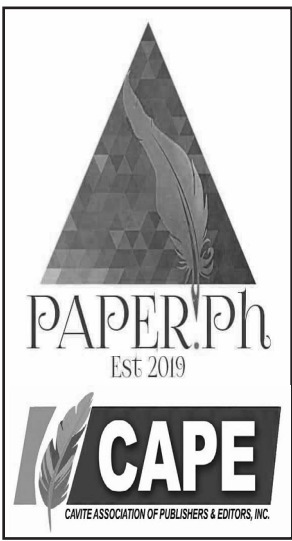

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LGUs, Business Leaders Highlight CALAX Subsection 3's Role in Driving Growth

The economic landscape of Cavite is poised for greater growth following the opening of the Cavite-Laguna Expressway (CALAX) Subsection 3, extending the expressway to Governor's Drive Interchange in General Trias City.

With CALAX now spanning 26 kilometers from Mamlasan, Biñan, Laguna to General Trias, Cavite, local government officials and business leaders cited the project's role in improving connectivity,

attracting investments, and creating new opportunities for businesses and communities.

Florencio Ayos, President of the Gen-Tri Business Club, said the new subsection is a long-awaited development that cuts travel time between Laguna and Cavite's industrial hubs to just 26 minutes.

"We are no longer a destination that is hard to reach — we are now a city that is impossible to ignore. Infrastructure is not



just about roads; it is about opening doors for every Filipino entrepreneur. General Trias is now better positioned than ever to attract investments, generate employment, and build a more resilient economy," Ayos stated.

General Trias City Mayor Luis "Jon Jon" Ferrer IV described the new interchange as 'a gateway to greater opportunities' that positions the city as a thriving center of industry. "Habang patuloy na lumalago ang General Trias bilang sentro ng industriya at kaunlaran, mahalaga ang proyektong tulad nito upang mas mailapit ang mga oportunidad sa ating mga kababayan," said Mayor Ferrer.

The positive outlook was echoed by Dasmariñas City Mayor Jennifer Barzaga, who emphasized that the expressway enhances access to commerce, education, and tourism.

"Ang proyektong

ito ay hindi lamang tungkol sa bagong kalsada, ito ay tungkol sa mas magandang kalidad ng buhay. Ang CALAX ay simbolo ng patuloy na progreso at ng ating sama-samang pangarap para sa isang mas maunlad, mas konektado, at mas maaliwalas na kinabukasan para sa bawat mamamayan," Mayor Barzaga noted.

Barangay Adlas (Silang) Captain Joelito Generoso highlighted the project's impact on local development. "Napakalak-ing benepisyo ng pagbukas ng CALAX Governor's Drive. Nagkaroon ng oportunidad sa negosyo, pagbubukas ng mga bagong trabaho, at pagtaas ng presyo ng lupa. Pinalakas din nito ang turismo at transportasyon ng mga kalakal," Barangay Capt. Generoso said.

Meanwhile, Barangay San Francisco (General Trias) Captain Ryan Santor pointed to the

long-term benefits of improved accessibility. "We believe that the opening of CALAX SS3 will bring lasting benefits to nearby communities through improved connectivity, increased investments, and easier transportation of goods and services," said Barangay Capt. Santor.

Beyond improving travel, the opening of CALAX Subsection 3 is expected to strengthen trade, support business expansion, and enhance Cavite's competitiveness as an investment destination.

CALAX is an MP-CALA Holdings Inc. project with the Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH) as project grantor. MPCALA Holdings Inc., the developer and operator of CALAX, is a subsidiary of the Metro Pacific Tollways Corporation (MPTC), the toll road arm of the Metro Pacific Investments Corporation (MPIC).

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ENDURING LEGACY FROM THE ASHES: Mekení leads business sector in unveiling Mt. Pinatubo commemorative marker

A commemorative marker honoring the 1991 eruption of Mt. Pinatubo was unveiled at the Clark Parade Grounds, marking the 35th anniversary of one of the most defining natural disasters in Philippine history and highlighting a shared story of resilience, recovery, and regional transformation.

The marker was jointly initiated by the Holy Angel University– Center for Kapampangan Studies (HAU-CKS), the Clark Development Corporation (CDC), the Department of Science and Technology–Philippine Institute of Vol-

canology and Seismology (DOST-PHIVOLCS), and Mekení Food Corporation, which represented the business sector of Central Luzon during the ceremonial unveiling.

Former President Gloria Macapagal-Arroyo



on collaboration between government, academia, science institutions, and the private sector.

Beyond remembrance, the initiative also highlights renewed opportunities for collaboration in heritage tourism, public education, and strategic communications, as Clark continues to position itself as a hub for history, innovation, and sustainable development.

For Mekení, participation in the project reinforces its continuing commitment to be more than a business success story. It stands as a living example of how adversity can shape long-term purpose, where growth is measured not only in scale, but in contribution to community rebuilding and regional identity.

As Central Luzon reflects on 35 years since Mt.

its mission, transforming survival into service, and rebuilding into purpose-driven growth. From these beginnings, Mekení evolved into a nationally recognized food manufacturing company, while maintaining deep roots in community development and regional pride.

Santos City National High School. During the visit, they received updates on infrastructure assessments and rehabilitation measures for facilities affected by the earthquake.

The visit underscores the administration's commitment to translating assessments into concrete action, accelerating school repairs, minimizing disruptions to learning, and helping affected communities recover as quickly as possible.

"While assessment and validation activities are ongoing, we are already taking action.

Alongside ensuring the safety of our schools, we are preparing for their rapid repair and reopening. As the President says, Mindanao will not be left behind," Secretary Angara said.

Earlier, engineers from the Department of Education (DepEd) Central Office, DepEd Region XII, and local field offices conducted rapid assessments to evaluate the structural integrity of school buildings and identify immediate repair requirements.

At present, DepEd and the Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH) have begun validating conditions in 12 schools in General Santos City, while assessments of 13 additional schools are scheduled in

the coming days. The findings will guide decisions on the safe use of facilities, repair priorities, and the allocation of response and recovery assistance.

General Santos City was among the areas affected by the powerful earthquake that originated in Maasim, Sarangani on June 8, prompting the suspension of classes in public schools. Across Region XII and neighboring regions, schools reported varying levels of damage, including impacts on classrooms and water, sanitation, and hygiene (WASH) facilities.

Based on the latest data as of June 10, DepEd has recorded damage in 1,022 public schools across five regions. The highest number of affected schools was reported in South Cotabato with 194, followed by North Cotabato with 172, and Sultan Kudarat with 157.

Validation and consolidation of reports from affected areas remain ongoing. To support the immediate recovery of schools, an estimated Php245.8 million is needed for clean-up, clearing operations, and minor repairs of damaged facilities. Initial response funds are currently being processed to enable the prompt implementation of necessary interventions and restore safe learning environments for students. Joint infrastructure safety

assessment missions are also continuing in General Santos City and other earthquake-affected areas.

DepEd and DPWH have likewise scheduled a three-day validation activity across various parts of Sarangani Province, including the municipalities of Alabel, Malapatan, Kiamba, Malungon, and Glan.

Assessment teams are conducting on-site inspections in priority schools, including Alabel National High School, Alabel CISC, Amado Quirit National High School, Malapatan National High School, Kinam National High School, Lun Padi-du National High School, Nian Integrated School, Kiamba National High School, New Canaan Integrated School, Glan Padi-du National High School, Glan School of Arts and Trades (GSAT), Tanao Bantilan National High School, Pangyan National High School, and Lumigo Integrated School.

Secretary Angara reaffirmed DepEd's commitment to restoring normal school operations as soon as possible, in line with the President's directive to prioritize the welfare of affected communities and ensure the continuity of education despite the challenges brought about by the disaster.

Patuloy na iniimbetigahan ng mga awtoridad kung sino ang nasa likod ng pagpapatakbo ng mga pasilidad at kung paano nagamit ang mga biktima sa illegal recruitment. Inaasahang kakasuhan ang mga responsible upang matigil ang ganitong uri ng ilegal na gawain.
